The Current Outlook

[From the Rosicrucian Viewpoint]

Cain and Seth in the World Today

HO are Cain and Seth? The answer to this question, which we mentioned briefly last month,

has an important bearing on today's world problems. In order properly to understand this subject it will be necessary to go back into prehistoric times a very great distance, and look at the records in the Memory of Nature, which the properly qualified modern seer can read. These records disclose the fact that man-in-the-making was originally double-sexed, as are some of the lower forms of invertebrate life today in the plant and animal kingdom.

In Lemuria, a continent which once existed over an area that now lies beneath the Pacific Ocean, it became neces-

sary to separate the sexes in order that half of the creative force might be diverted upward to build

the brain and larynx. And then the trouble began! Like all the evolutionary processes of nature this change was very slow and consumed an immense amount of time, as we can observe similarly today in the slow evolution of plants and animals. Doubtless it occupied many, many thousands of years. In this process the female sex came into existence first.

This is the point in history where the important matter of Cain and Seth made its appearance. It was necessary during this period that the Egos of the human life wave should continue to incarnate, and this was accomplished through the instrumentality of the great Lucifer

spirit Samael. The Rosicrucian doctrine and the Masonic legend relative to this subject have some minor differences but agree in the main essentials.

The Rosicrucian doctrine says: "Samael united with Eve and begat a semi-divine son, Cain." This simply means that during this immense period, when there were women but no men, the Lucifer spirit Samael transmitted to woman the seed atom of the body of the coming child, which is necessary in order for any conception to take place. The seed atom is a spiritual thing, not a physical atom, and the same one is carried for-

TRANSMISSION of THE tions. Being spiritual, it was possible for Samael, a spiritual being,

to transmit it. Thus, in effect, Samael became the father of all the Egos who took incarnation during that long period, since the transmission of the seed atom is the essential part of fatherhood. All of these Egos became known as the sons of Cain, Cain being a synonym for Lucifer, and Samael being his ambassador or regent.

During this long period the sons of Cain doubtless incarnated many times with the aid of Samael, who impressed some of his divine nature upon the seed atoms of their etheric, physical, and desire bodies. Thus they became semi-divine, imbued with the creator instinct of Lucifer. Samael's influence was impressed in a manner similar to that by which the divine nature of Christ was

impressed upon the seed atoms of the vehicles of the man Jesus, which vehicles Christ used during the three years' ministry. As a result of this, Max Heindel said it was his belief that Jesus will become the highest Initiate of the Earth Period, and thereby occupy in the next great world period a position similar to that of Jehovah, the Holy Spirit, in the present one. The creative instinct of the sons of Cain causes them to specialize in the arts, crafts, science and statecraft. It is from this section of humanity that the truly creative individualities of the race are drawn.

In due time, after aeons of development under Jehovah's guidance, the male sex (Adam) made its appearance, and then Samael's function as the father of the race ceased and was taken over by the male element of the human species. Thus, as stated in the Masonic legend, "Samael was ousted by Jehovah," and the sons of Cain became "the sons of the widow" because Eve, the "Sons of female element, was no THE WIDOW" longer wedded to her divine spouse Samael. The offspring of Adam and Eve are referred to collectively in the Bible as "Abel," and in their later incarnations as "Seth." They were purely human, not semidivine, because the divine spirit Samael did not impress his influence upon the seed atoms of their bodies. Thus the sons of Seth, as might be expected, are more passive in nature, less creative, and more negative than Cain.

After Adam appeared upon the scene the sons of Cain continued to incarnate through Adam and Eve, that is, through man and woman, and so continue even to the present day. But during that long period when Samael was their father they received a divine impress which they will never lose, and which from the inner standpoint makes them distinct from Seth.

The ancient rivalry between Jehovah and Lucifer for leadership of the human race and its attendant conflict of

celestial interests has been transmitted to Cain and Seth, and a subtle antagonism, though covered with the accretions of ages, still exists between their respective institutions of Freemasonry and Catholicism. When we say "Freemasonry" we particularly mean Esoteric Masonry, although with some exceptions the exoteric fraternal Masons of today are sons of Cain. Rosicrucianism is esoteric Masonry, and therefore those who are following the Rosicrucian path of development are Freemasons in the truest sense of the term. Similarly, by "Catholicism" we mean universal catholicism, that is, all the churches of Faith, not merely the Greek and Roman Catholic churches.

As the division of the sexes in ancient Lemuria was the starting point of all the trouble, strife, sorrow and war in the world, conversely when we reach the New Galilee in which war and trouble will be a thing of the past, sex also will have disappeared. It will take thousands of years to accomplish this, however. According to the occult axiom "the first shall be last," since the female sex came first, so it will be the last to disappear. The male sex will go out of existence at a more rapid rate than the other, a process which has already started. Strife and conflict will not finally disappear until the two poles of man's being are again united in one individuality.

As to Freemasonry and Catholicism, there is need for both in the world today because one is suited to the sons of Cain, who follow the path of knowledge, and the other to the sons of Seth, who advance through faith and feeling. Their methods, however, are quite radically different. Contrast the Masonic attitude which never urges, never proselytes, never invites a candidate to join a lodge, but which waits for the seeker after Light to knock and request admittance of his own free will, with the evangelism and the sometimes inquisitional methods of Catholicism.

The Mason knows that each soul must save itself, whereas the Catholic system, with the exception of the Protestant branch, makes use of the Mass, which is a Latin ritual whose vibrations act power-

fully upon the etheric bodies of its followers.
It is stated in Rosicrucian literature that "were the Catholics to

abandon the Latin ritual (the Mass) there would not be one of their followers left in ten years." Thus the Mass is a sort of etheric tie by which the divine leaders of the sons of Seth lead them slowly forward toward the kingdom of heaven. The sons of Cain find their way there under their own motive power, aided by the vibrations of the indwelling Christ Spirit of the earth.

The word "Freemason" comes from "Phree Messen," Children of Light. It is stated in the Rosicrucian Freemasonry and Catholicism that "the Lodges of Phree Messen (Children of Light) of ancient Egypt are now transferred to the various branches of the Anglo-Saxon race." "Freemasonry today," say the Rosicrucians, "is an attempt by the Hierarchs of Fire, the Lucifer Spirits, to bring us the imprisoned spirit 'Light,' that by it we may see and know." The sons of Cain by their very nature must see and know; they cannot progress otherwise.

The conflict which was set in motion acons ago in ancient Lemuria by the di-

vision of the sexes has extended not only to man and woman, but to the home presided over by woman, and to industry presided over by man, to state and church, to the Catholic element which is female in nature, and to the Masonic element which is male in quality. Thus we have economic strife, labor conflicts, widespread divorce, church squabbles, international jealousies, war, personal enmity, and everything apparently but universal friendship. All this must change and will in time. The outwelling vibrations of the Christ Spirit in the earth are slowly effecting this change, although it will take several centuries more to complete it.

It has always been a puzzle to the historians that Christianity, in the comparatively short historical period from the time of Christ to 1000 a.d. should have converted practically all of pagan and semibarbarous Europe. And yet there is nothing strange about it when we realize that 2000 years ago a brand new evolutionary force of tremendous

in about 700 years. It will be fully in effect in the New Galilee, which will come at a much later period, when the Christ Spirit will actually return in an etheric body to rule over a unified and spiritualized humanity under the law of love, which will replace the regime of retributive law under Jehovah.

Lucifer, the Light-Bringer, and Jehovah, the Lawgiver, will then have reconciled their respective regimes, and the sons of Cain and of Seth will have followed suit. Church and State, which now properly should be separated, will then have been reunited under Christ, who, says Max Heindel, the Rosicrucian Initiate, "like Melchizedek shall fill the dual office of king and priest, and shall rule over a purged and glorified humanity which has risen from sex love to soul love."

Race Religions and Easter

EFORE the Christ all religions were race religions, and all were given by Jehovah. These

race religions are to be superseded by the universal religion of the Sun Spirit Christ which shall unite all men into one brotherhood. The change from one to the other and the fact that the religion of the lunar God Jehovah must precede the religion of the Sun Spirit Christ are symbolized by the manner in which Easter is determined.

The rule in present use for determining the time of Easter is that it falls on the first Sunday following the Paschal Full Moon. This was the original time adopted by the earliest Christians, who had knowledge of and regard for the occult significance; but very soon ignorant people started schisms and fixed it at different times. This occasioned no little controversy. In the second century a dispute arose on this point between the Eastern and Western churches. Eastern Christians celebrated Easter on the 14th day of the first Jewish month or moon, considering it to be equivalent to the Jewish Passover. The Western Christians kept it on the Sunday after the 14th day, holding that it was the commemoration of the Resurrection of Jesus. The Council of Nice, 325 A.D., decided in favor of the Western use, branding the Eastern practice with the name of heresy. This, however, only settled the point that Easter was to be held not on a certain day of the month or moon but on a Sunday. The proper astronomical cycle for calculating the occurrence of Easter was not yet determined, but they finally deferred to the ancient method of fixing the festival by the moon, and so the ancient original custom was finally revived.

Thus Easter is now held upon the same day as required by the occult tradition, as is necessary to properly symbolize the cosmic significance of the event. In this respect both the sun and moon are necessary factors, for Easter is not merely a solar festival. The sun must not only go past the equator as it does on the 21st of March, but the full moon after the vernal equinox must also be passed, and then the following Sunday is Easter, the day of resurrection. The light of the vernal sun must be reflected by a full moon before Easter day can dawn on earth.

There is, as said, a deep meaning hidden behind this method of determining Easter, namely, that humanity was not sufficiently evolved to have the religion of the sun, the Christian religion of universal brotherhood, until they had been fully prepared through the religions of the moon which segregated and separated humanity into groups, nations, and races. This is symbolized by the annual rise of the Sun Spirit at Easter be-

ing deferred until the Jehovistic Moon has thrown back and fully reflected the light of the Easter Sun.

All the founders of race religions, Hermes, Buddha, Moses, et cetera, were Initiates in the Jehovistic Mysteries. They were Sons of Seth. At their Initiation they became ensouled by their particular Race Spirit, and this Spirit speaking through the mouth of such an Initiate gave laws to his people, as for instance, the decalogue of Moses, the laws of Manu, the noble truths of Buddha, et cetera. These laws manifested sin because the people did not and could not keep them at their stage of evolution. So they made a certain debt of destiny in consequence. This destiny the human Initiate-founder of the religion had to take upon himself, and so he had to be born again and again to help his people.

Christ, on the other hand, did not need to take birth in the first place. He came of His own free will to help humanity, to abrogate the law that brings sin, and to emancipate humanity from the law of sin and death. The race religions of the lunar God Jehovah conveyed the will of God to mankind in an indirect manner through seers prophets, who were but imperfect instruments as the lunar rays imperfectly transmit the light of the sun. The mission of these religions was to prepare mankind for the universal religion of the Sun Spirit Christ, who manifested among us without an intermediary as the light which comes direct from the sun, and "we beheld His glory as of the alone begotten of the Father" when He taught the Gospel of Love.

The Christian religion gives no laws but preaches love as the fulfillment of the law. Therefore no debts of destiny are generated under it and so Christ, who was under no necessity to be born in the first place, will not be drawn to rebirth under the Law of Causation as were the founders of the lunar race religions who must bear from time to time the sins of their followers. When Christ appears it will

be in a body made of the two higher ethers, the light and reflecting ethers, the Golden Wedding Garment called soma psuchicon or soul body by Paul, who is very emphatic in his assertion that "flesh and blood cannot inherit the Kingdom of God." He asserts that we shall be changed and be like Christ. If we cannot enter the Kingdom in a fleshly body, it would be absurd to suppose that the King of Glory would wear such a coarse cumbersome garment.

The priestcraft from which Jehovah drew His representatives, the prophets and founders of religions and the spiritual temple builders, are the Sons of Seth, the son of Adam and Eve. sonic legend says Eve was created first, that from the union of Samael, the Lucifer spirit, with her, Cain was born, from whom descended all the craftsmen of the world, including Hiram Abiff.) Sons of Cain still feel in their breasts the divine nature of their ancestor. They repudiate the indirect method of salvation by faith of the church, and insist upon finding the Light of Wisdom themselves by the direct method of work, perfecting themselves in the arts and crafts and building the temple of material civilization by industry and statecraft according to the plan of God, the Grand Architect of the Universe, Christ being the "Chief Corner Stone," and each mystic Mason a "living stone."

In time however these two great streams, the Sons of Seth and the Sons of Cain, must unite in order to reach the portals of the Kingdom of Christ. Before His time there was no way in which such an amalgamation could take place, but when Christ the great Sun Spirit came, Solomon was reborn as Jesus, into whom the Christ Spirit entered at the Baptism, and Hiram Abiff was reborn as Lazarus. When Lazarus was raised up by the strong grip of the paw of the Lion of Judah, Hiram and Solomon, the former antagonists, sank their differences as prompted by the Christ Spirit, and both are working now for the establishment of the Kingdom of Christ.

Easter Thoughts

ASTER is the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Sun has entered Aries at the vernal

equinox. At this full moon, because the Sun is in Aries, where its creative energies are strongest, the Moon must be in Libra, the sign of marriage and partnerships. It hints that heaven takes earth into partnership, that Christ unites Himself with His brethren, the Church or Bride.

Aries is the sign of the Lamb or Christ, and in the Crucifixion Drama, Aries was on the Cross of the Meridian and the Equator. The foot of the cross is Libra. The Crucifixion occurs on the Equinox, in the sixth hour, the actual time when the Sun (Son) dies. The veil in the Temple was rent in twain, that is to say, in two equal parts. Hence at the Equinox, day and night are equal. Two thieves were also crucified on either side of Christ-Cancer and Capricorn. One thief went to Paradise with Jesus; Cancer rose. Capricorn sank, below the horizon into the netherworld which is the Kingdom of Satan or Saturn.

The Crucifixion symbolizes the lowest point of attainment in the descent of the Logos into Matter, the Sun (Logos) reaching the lowest meridian for the northern hemisphere at the time of the culminating act of the drama. Then it ascends. After Spirit has become involved in Matter to the extent necessary to develop a fund of experiences, evolution begins and the spiritual powers become manifest. It is only after humanity has reached its lowest point in matter or world experience, that it truly begins to ascend in permanent progress toward the higher planes or spheres of being.

All the elements of this Sacrifice on Golgotha's brow or hill are peculiarly our own elements of progress and experience. Every man and every woman meets a lowest point or Nadir in human existence at some time before passing beyond, and everyone is destined to personal crucifixion on a cross of his own making, before he or she can lawfully expect to rise in spiritual power. The personal crucifixion is absolutely necessary to develop the desire and stimulus to rise; otherwise humanity would be more or less content to passively accept things as they are as long as they could endure them. Our personal crucifixion is derived from the fact that "in Him we live and move and have our being." It is the outer symbol of a "divine discontent," a Spirit moving humanity to progress to a higher and better estate.

The two thieves of the crucifixion drama are always with us. They are our lusts and our desires. Lusts will always remain-lusts, and are therefore doomed to destruction. The other thief-desiremay at times appear to rob our higher selves, but desire can always be purified, hence saved and ultimately redeemed so as to go with us into our Paradise or better, fairer living conditions.

The Veil that must be rent is the veil spiritual ignorance. Many, some placed in very humble positions in our world, with little, apparently, to give cheer or optimism, have nevertheless a clear vision of life, and as they live up to it according to their abilities, they are blessed in the possession of an inner light or radiance denied to many who may enjoy great earthly and worldly blessings.

For the true purpose of life consists in first understanding it, and then trying to shape the life in accordance with this knowledge, trying to live as befits sons and daughters of God, using the creative energies wisely and well, subjugating selfish desires and purifying the mirror of the mind so as to reflect Divine Wisdom.

Easter! Resurrection Power! Yes, many would like magical power over their fellows, but they are seldom prepared to pay the price, self-abnegation and selfsacrifice, service to Man. And until they have to some extent subjugated the lower self and yielded obedience to the higher, the door of the mystical temple must be shut, for real power can only be wielded by "the lover of all that lives." The torch of Power must be carried by the hands of Love, by those who strive for the heavenly mind, seeking those things which are above. Otherwise chaos, not order, would reign; destruction, evolution or progress, would ensue.

ways. There may be temporary wonder and awe among a few bystanders, but the large majority of humanity would be unaffected.


Looking back upon the Resurrection of the Master, we read in it not something peculiar to Him, but the token of a higher destiny towards which all creation moves. The mountains and hills are to break forth into singing, and all the trees of the forest are to clap their hands. The period of night, of weeping, is to pass; the morning of joy come. Already the dawn of that morning of joy has arrived with the Resurrection of our Forerunner, the Lord Jesus.

So many good things are coming to humanity, that we, like the Apostles, may believe not for joy, and wonder. Only Wisdom enables one to lift the Veil that hides the Virgin of Eternal Truth from the careless eyes of men.

No Easter is complete without the lily, the Bermuda lily being the favorite everywhere. Its waxen-white petals are six in number, symbol of Virgo, The Virgin, sixth sign of the zodiac. Not only does it

symbolize the purity and heavenliness of that new and endless life bestowed by the Christ Spirit, it also symbolizes the brotherhood of man, and this means the unselfish service of man.

The great occultist, Max Heindel, saw that humanity must outgrow patriotism and learn to say with Thomas Paine: "The world is my country, to do good is my religion." He pointed out that at the present time there is a tendency to exalt "self" above all else. The division of the world into nations, tribes, and families must vanish before Universal Brotherhood can become a fact.

The great English reformer, John Wesley, declared that the world was his parish. God who is ALL-in-All has no limited viewpoint, His love is over all, includes all. We are members one of another. We are meant to do honor to one another. Lives have crept long on broken wings, through cells of madness, haunts of horror and fear, divided by several group allegiances. It is time for mankind to unite, to embrace the purpose of God and to win through to the eternal life that is their birthright.

Seeking Truth

WO thousand years ago Pilate asked, "What is truth?" The asked, "What is truth?" The various forms of religious faiths

in existence are all separate attempts of men to embody their inner conceptions of truth. Religion, however, advances as men's vision broadens. The immortal spirit within cries out for a fuller revelation. A new revelation appears in answer to the cry and a higher conception of God dawns upon the minds of men. Religion has not actually taken a higher octave, but our ideas relative to religion have broadened.

Christ said, "The truth shall make you free." Truth is eternal and the quest for truth must also be eternal. Occultism knows no "faith once for all delivered." All schools of occultism are founded on the same basic truths, which may be viewed from different angles, each giving a different view, which may complement the previous ones. Therefore, so far as we can see at present, there is no such achievement possible as arriving at the ultimate truth.

In answer to the question, What is truth?-we must first realize that truth is subjective principle and is not to be found in the objective. The objective has manifestations of truth. The error is that we seek to discover truth in the external, somewhere outside ourselves.

Whatever appears as truth to a man, is truth to him; whatever his conception of God, so is God revealed to him. (This does not in the least affect the truth as to what God really is.) Our idea of truth changes as we progress; for as we climb the mountain trail of evolution phases of truth appear which we never before perceived.

Where, then, shall we find truth? Truth in the abstract cannot be found in this phenomenal world where we live amid untold illusions, constantly making

corrections and allowances whether we realize it or not. We know that our eyes deceive us when they make it appear as if the houses come together at the end of a long street, for instance.

In answer to the question, Where shall we seek truth? there is only one answer-within. It is absolutely a matter of inner development, and the promise of the Christ that "if we live the life, we shall know the doctrine" is true in the most literal sense. Books and teachers may arouse our interest and urge us to live the life, but only in so far as we judge their ideas carefully before we make their precepts a part of our own inner life, are we really seeking in the right direction. Max Heindel has told us that the Elder Brothers did not teach him directly since that first short period when the material in the Cosmo was given. Whenever a question was asked, the Teacher indicated the direction in which he might search for the required information. It is by using our own faculties that we get the information of most value to ourselves.

Aspiration is the first step from bondage to freedom, for unless a man aspires to rise, he will never rise. It is only as we aspire to virtue, that we overcome vice. Obedience to the spiritual is freedom from the sensual. Indifference will wither the fairest flower of the spirit.

All occult development begins with the vital body, with the cultivation of the ordinary objective faculties such as observation, discrimination, reason, judgment, sound common sense, and the cultivation of the intellect. All these faculties, when blended with a true sense of devotion and true prayer, will lead the student to more difficult stages of his journey. This preparation within the student must be done, regardless of outer circumstances.

The two lower ethers of the vital body, the chemical and life ethers, decrease in quantity and density as the two higher ethers, forming the soul body, increase in volume, and a greater power begins to pour through us. This sometimes causes disturbances in the physical body, as it is the lower ethers which sustain the body in health. This condition is only transitory, however; therefore it can readily be seen how important it is for occult students to continue to aspire.

If one should undertake to acquire occult powers without high ideals or selfless motives, the physical result would be deplorable. A great number of physical wrecks among occult students is due to this fact. Every selfish thought, every thought of enmity, hatred, or anger is stamped upon the blood in the lungs and retards the regenerative process.

Thoughts of love, justice, and harmony, on the other hand, build the vital body and increase vitality of the physical body.

In the average individual regeneration takes

place at a very slow rate, because the ordinary individual usually injects back into the blood stream the same old thoughts and enmities; hence trouble and disease always stay with him. In the occult student, this regenerative process takes place much more quickly, and in many cases the entire blood stream may be practically regenerated in a few months. Some of the old thoughts, however, are bound to creep into the renewed blood stream, and so the process goes on repeating itself until we are completely purified of all dross.

We must change the robe of our unpurified bodies for the shining garment which we are weaving day by day. This is the alchemical process. The result is perfect health. When we are pure gold, when the blood stream carries only pure, Christ-like thoughts, then it is that we apparently perform miracles. With the surplus energy, we heal others, dispel in-

harmony, sorrow, and suffering; and radiate love, peace, and good will. Then it is that we rise above family bonds or racial ties, although performing all duties, for we have purified ourselves of such blood ties. We become universal. The heart, the great blood distributing center, does not then discriminate, but loves all irrespective of creed, color, or caste. Christ said, "Ye must be born again." This rebirth extends itself to the physical according to the Hermetic axiom "As above, so below."

Thus we see that it is only within ourselves that the vehicle is built which will enable us to perceive truth on the inner planes. In bringing our lives to harmonize with divine principles and in accordance with true religion, we are building the soul body or Golden Wedding Garment. A life of love and service to

others builds the soul body. Such a life not only attracts and builds in a large proportion of the two higher ethers, the reflecting and light ethers, but in time it also causes a cleavage to take place

between them and the two lower ethers. After this cleavage has been accomplished, the soul body is available for soul flights. It constitutes the gold and blue of the aura and distinguishes the saint from the ordinary man. We are helped to build it by Christ, the indwelling planetary spirit of the earth, through His etheric emanations, which pass from the center of the earth outward and through our vital bodies on the way.

The soul body continues to grow after it has been separated by cleavage from the lower ethers, provided it is fed. Like any other body, it must receive food in order to grow and remain in a condition of health and strength. But if we fail to feed the Christ Child within, we shall experience a great soul hunger, compared with which physical hunger is nothing. As our conceptions of truth become broader, the vital body demands a higher type of food in the form of good litera-

ture, art, and music, and a life of kindliness and service to others.

A mental conception of truth is not sufficient, it must be a spiritual realiza-Reason and discrimination are necessary faculties from an intellectual standpoint, but the greatest intellect would fail without spiritual assimilation. The heart and the intellect must cooperate. We are not all of the same degree of mentality, therefore truth conceived by the mind would not be the same. to all. But spirit is one, so he who is spiritually conscious will "know the truth." It will be apparent that there is a wide difference between knowing the truth and possessing merely a mental conception of it.

The path of personal preparation is the price we pay for truth. Conscious realization is the result of living the life

after strict moral and spiritual standards. It can be attained in no other way.

Emerson has said, "A man should learn to detect and watch that gleam of light which flashes across his mind from

within more than the luster of the firmament of bards and sages. Yet he dismisses without notice his thought, because it is his. In every work of genius we recognize our own rejected thoughts; they come back to us with a certain alienated majesty. . . .

"We but half express ourselves and are ashamed of that divine idea which each of us represents. It is easy in the world to live after the world's opinion; it is easy in solitude to live after our own; but the great man is he, who in the midst of the crowd, keeps with perfect sweetness, the independence of solitude. . . .

"We lie in the lap of immense intelligence, which makes us receivers of its truth, and organs of its activity. Nothing can bring you peace but yourself."

The question naturally arises in the mind of the student—How may we know truth when we have found it? In Letters

to Students (by Max Heindel) we find the answer to our question by referring to the Evening Exercise of Retrospection. The Teacher said at the time of giving it, that if it were possible to prevail upon the most depraved person in the world to perform this exercise faithfully for six months, he would be permanently reformed; and those who are faithful have found that it sharpens all mental faculties, particularly the memory. Besides, by this impartial judgment of one's self night after night, one learns to discern truth from error in a degree not attainable in any other way.

Within ourselves is the only worthy Tribunal of Truth. If we consistently and persistently take our problems before this tribunal, we shall in the course of time, evolve such a superior sense of truth, that, instinctively, whenever we

hear an idea advanced, we shall know whether it is sound and true or false. Unless we have established, or started to establish, this inner tribunal of truth, we may be wandering from place to place, mentally speaking,

all our lives and finding no rest, knowing little more at the end than at the beginning, and perhaps less.

Therefore the student should never accept or reject, or follow blindly any authority, but strive to establish the tribunal of truth within. Refer all matters to that tribunal, proving all things and holding fast to that which is good.

We have yet another method whereby we may know Truth from the imitation. There are many people who search the civilized world for rare treasures of ancient art. There are also many who manufacture imitations of the genuine articles, so the seeker after these things always runs the risk of being duped, unless he has a means of knowing the genuine article. In this respect, he is beset by the same danger as the Truth Seeker. The collector often shuts up his find in a sacret place and gloats over it in soli-

tude. And not infrequently, after years, or maybe when he has died, it is found that some of the things that he guarded most jealously and treasured most highly, were imitations of no value. Similarly, he who finds what he believes to be Truth may "bury his treasure" in his own breast, or "put his light under a bushel," only to find, maybe after many years, that he has been swindled by an imitation.

Thus there is need of a reliable final test, one which eliminates all possibility of deception. The question is how to dis-

cover and apply it.

The answer is as simple as the method is efficient. When we ask how collectors know that a certain article they prize is an imitation, we shall find that it is usually by showing it to some one who has seen the original. If the collector shows his find in public, instead of hoarding it in secret, he will quickly learn by the collective knowledge of all the world, whether his collection is genuine or not.

Just as the secretiveness of collectors aids and fosters frauds on the part of the curio dealers, so also the desire to have

and to hold for one's self, secrets not known to the public, fosters the business of those who trade in occult "imitations." How can we test the worth of a tool, but by using it and thus finding out whether it will keep its edge in actual wearing work? Would we buy it, if the salesman required us to put it in a dark corner where no one could see it and forbade us to use it? Certainly not. We would want to use it in our work and there show whether it had wearing qualities. If it were found to be "true steel," we would prize it.

On the very same principle, why buy the wares of secret mongers? If their wares were genuine, there would be no need of secrecy, and unless we could use them in our daily lives, they are of no value. So it is obligatory on every one who finds the Truth to use it in the world's work, both as a safeguard to himself, to make sure it will stand the test, and to give others a chance to share the treasure which he himself finds helpful. Therefore, it is very vital that we follow the command of Christ: "Let your

light shine."

And go quickly, and tell his disciples that he is risen from the dead; and behold, he goeth before you into Galilee; there shall ye see him.

And as they went to tell his disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, All Hail. And they came and held him by the feet, and worshiped him. (Matthew 28:2-10.)

A full comprehension of the cosmic nature of the Christ brings a new inspiration to the immortal words: "He is risen." The Constellation



of Capricorn

"Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except a corn of wheat fall into the ground and die, it abideth alone; but if it die, it bringeth forth much fruit." (John 12:24.)

(IN TWELVE PARTS-PART FIVE)

N the preceding chapters we have had before us, in Virgo, Libra, Scorpio, and Sagittarius, the

work of the Redeemer set forth, according to the scriptures and primeval astronomy. His own glorious Person was concerned. In this second group, Capricorn, Aquarius, Pisces, and Aries, presented in four chapters, we see the results of His humiliation, conflict and victory-the blessings they procured for His redeemed people.

CAPRICORN. Here we have the picture of a fallen goat, with the vigorous tail of a fish-half goat and half fish. The goat is bowing its head as though falling down in death. The right leg is folded underneath the body, and he seems unable to rise with the left. The tail of the fish, on the other hand, seems to be full of vigor and life. In Part One we had the Blessed One likened to a grain of corn or seed, denoted by Spica, the ear of wheat. It was necessary for this seed or grain of wheat to fall into the ground and die in order to reach its intended fruitfulness. Now we see Him come to

"die" and hence not abiding alone, but bringing forth "much fruit." (John 12:24.) When this Promised Seed was born the Sun was in the sign of Capricorn. "The fullness of time was come." and "God sent forth His Son to redeem them that were under the law."

The goat is a sacrificial animal. God commanded the children of Israel, saving, "Take ye a kid of the goats for a sin-offering." (Lev. 9:3.) Aaron "took the goat, which was the sin-offering for the people, and slew it, and offered it for sin." (Lev. 9.15.) And of the goat of the sin-offering Moses said, "It is most holy, and God hath given it you to bear the iniquity of the congregation to make atonement for them before the Lord." (Lev. 10.17.) This is the falling and dying of Christ as the sin-offering to which He refers in the text. It is the Seed of the woman, in the attitude and condition of a sacrifice for sin.

The names in this sign also point to the same thought and significance. Its stars, Gedi and Dabih, in Hebrew, Arabic, and Syriac, mean cut-off, the hewn-down, the sacrifice slain. The ancient zodiacs picture the goat with a fish's tail and in Egypt it was called Hupenius, which means the place of the sacrifice.

In addition to the falling and dying, it is the sign of mystic procreation and bringing forth. That which is brought forth is a fish, a familiar and wellunderstood sacred symbol. Christ, the Fisher of men, speaks of His saved ones as "born of water." (John 3:5.) In the Goat we have the Atoning Sacrifice; in the Fish we have the people for whom the atonement is made, "a great multitude which no man can number"-the forgiveness and regeneration of men and their incorporation with Christ-something altogether miraculous. We see the literal death of one being issuing in the spiritual life of other beings, of whose new life He is the life. It is Christ in the one case corporeally sacrificed, and His people mystically resurrected to newness of life in the other. There is no resurrection where there has been no dying. Beginning to live in Christ, we begin to die to the old carnal life. The Seed of the woman takes our death penalty on himself, so that believers die with Him to all the old life.

Mythology tells us the gods were feasting near a great river when suddenly the terrible Typhon came upon them, compelling them to assume other shapes in order to escape his fury. Bacchus took the form of a goat and plunged into the river, and that part of his body which was under water took the form of a fish. Jupiter commemorated the occurrence in the sky. The Dearly Beloved Son was plunged into the deep waters of death that we might have life abundant.

SAGITTA, THE ARROW

This arrow is pictured in mid-heaven alone, as having been shot forth by an invisible hand. It is not the arrow of Sagittarius, for that has not left his bow. That arrow is for the enemies of God. This is for the Son of God. He was "pierced," when he could say with Job, "the arrows of the Almighty are within me." It was "the will of God" which

Jesus came to do. Not a mere work of mercy for miserable sinners, but a work ordained in eternity past, for the glory of God in eternity future. The work which the arrow accomplishes is seen in the dying Goat and in the falling Eagle (our next picture). There is a spiritual piercing and slaying in the case of those who come to new life in Christ, akin to the piercing and slaying of Christ himself. Sharp and hurtful words are com-The arrow of soverpared to arrows. eign justice which drank up the life of Christ as our Substitute and Propitiation passes through Him to pierce also those whose life in sin cost Him all this humiliation and pain, that they may live the Christ-life as His renewed and redeemed children.

AQUILA, THE WOUNDED AND FALLING EAGLE

This is another picture of the grain of wheat falling and dying. The brightest star therein is Altair, which in Arabic means the wounded. Other stars in this group are: Al Shain, the scarlet-colored—covered with blood; Alcair, the piercing; Tarared, wounded or torn; Al Okal, wounded in the heel.

The eagle is a royal bird, the natural enemy of the serpent. It is elevated in its habits, strong and swift. It is very careful and tender toward its young, and is said to tear itself to nourish them with its own blood when all other means fail. Here is the noble Eagle, the promised Seed of the woman, pierced, torn and bleeding, that those begotten in His image may be saved from death, protected and made to live forever.

"Thine arrows stick fast in Me... My heart panteth, My strength faileth Me, As for the light of Mine eyes, it is gone from Me." (Psalms 38: 2, 10.)

DELPHINUS, THE DOLPHIN

This is the figure of a vigorous fish leaping upward. Taken in connection with the dying goat, it conveys the idea of springing up again out of death. Quickening, life, and spiritual resurrection (Continued on page 168)



THE STATE

Science vs. Astrology

Astrology, frequently condemned as a pseudo-science by law and usually opposed by the church, has flourished from the earliest days. Today more horoscopes are being cast than ever. Newsstands are littered with astrological pamphlets, forecasts and journals, and some 100 big city papers publish astrology columns. Recently, appalled that this "pernicious superstition" is "not limited to the less educated sections of our population," the American Association of Scientific Workers decided it was time for a full-out attack on astrology.

A report issued by Prof. Bart J. Bok and Mrs. Margaret W. Myall of Harvard University's Astronomy department declared: "Scientists can do a valuable service by pointing out that the predictions of astrology lack every conceivable scientific foundation." In combatting astrology by education, they said, scientists can point out such facts these:

Astrologers offer no "workable mechanism by which the stars and planets can exert influence on human destiny." At birth, for instance, "only under the most favorable conditions can the gravitational attraction of the planet Mars equal that produced by the doctor in attendance."

Many scientific statistical studies have shown there is none save random correlation between the time of birth and life's events. A study of persons listed in American Men of Science found only a "random distribution" of birth dates—so scientific bent is not determined by the stars. Likewise a Stanford psychologist, investigating the standard astrological assertion that persons born under Libra should be musical, studied the birthdates of 1,498 musicians. Fewer were born under Libra than any other sign except Scorpio. In 1932 Otto Bobertag, a German scientist, invited Germany's leading astrologers to cast the horoscopes of a number of persons whose identities were unknown to them. He found no resemblance between the horoscopes and the facts.

The Scientific Workers believe that astrology is like strong drink—an escape from reality. Concluding that astrologers have offered the horoscope "as a substitute for honest and sustained thinking," the Association will couple an attempt to stiffen anti-astrology laws with its educational campaign.—The Pathfinder, Feb. 8, 1941.

After reading this article, the first question that presents itself is, just how well posted on the subject of astrology is the American Association of Scientific Workers? This question naturally suggests another one quite as pertinent. If the individuals presuming to pass judgment on this science have not all made a thorough study of it, are they in any position to pass judgment on a subject which, according to their own statements. is attracting the attention of those "not limited to the less educated sections of our population"? A rather sweeping judgment to pass on a large class of people who happen not to agree with their opinion, is it not?

A report issued by Prof. Bart J. Bok and Mrs. Margaret W. Myall of Harvard University's Astronomy department declares that scientists (of what particular branch of learning?) can do much valuable service by pointing out that predictions of astrology lack every conceivable scientific foundation, and then proceeds to point out a few, thereby revealing a deplorable ignorance relative to the teaching of the science discussed. For example: "At birth, for instance . . . can the gravitational attraction of the planet Mars equal that produced by the doctor in attendance." Even the beginning student in astrology knows that astrology, being a spiritual science, is not considering Mars' gravitational attraction, but the spiritual vibratory impulse sent out by the great planetary spirit ruling that particular planet.

"Many scientific statistical studies have shown that there is none save random correlation between the time of birth and life's events." Astrology does not deal with "random correlation." To the contrary, it has proved in hundreds of cases by investigation in relation to birth data and the principal events in

life that the horoscope is an unusually true map of each individual's life, even indicating when outstanding events are due to take place. Astrology also emphasizes the fact that man, having free will, does have the power to change many events in the course of his life—that while the vibratory influence of the stars impels it does not compel.

"A study of persons listed in American Men of Science found only a 'random distribution' of birth dates—so scientific bent is not determined by the stars." Just what has the casting of a horoscope to do with this statement? Charts cast without birth data of course are useless and no real astrologer has time to spend on speculative data. They all require the place of birth, the month, day, hour and minute in order to give out correct information.

"Likewise a Stanford psychologist [?] investigating the standard astrological assertion that persons born under Libra should be musical studied the birth dates of 1,498 musicians. Fewer were born under Libra than any other sign," etc. Here only one point in considering a chart is used-the birth month. While it is true that persons born in Libra have the possibility of being musical, still the chart as a whole must be considered, with all of its houses, aspects, et cetera, before one could come to any definite conclusions. Any birth month may favor musical talent provided other aspects, et cetera, are favorable. Libra, however, ruled by Venus, does favor musical talent.

Relative to Otto Bobertag's findings, one would like to know something of his astrological ability to judge horoscopes before accepting his decisions as final.

True, astrologers are not infallible in their judgment in delineating a horoscope, and mistakes are sometimes made; but so do people in all other lines of work make mistakes. Doctors often give a wrong diagnosis, astronomers make miscalculations, physicists prove one thing as absolutely true today and disprove it as absolutely false tomorrow. There is no science the findings of which

may not at times be found to contain faulty deduction. So why select any particular one to denounce and endeavor to legislate against?

How Planetary Rays Affect Our Lives

Question:

One hears a great deal these days about the influence of the stars on the life of each person. I would like to know how it is possible for a star or stars to affect one's life.

Answer:

Cosmic Biochemistry

CCORDING to Paracelsus, renowned occult physician of the middle ages, universal sympathy, attraction and mutual interaction and relationship prevail everywhere in the universe between those forms or qualities of will that are identical or harmonious in their na-

ture. Sympathy exists between stars and plants, between planets and planets, between plants and plants, and between plants and the organs of the body.

Man is not constituted out of separate material essentially distinct from all other cosmic material in its make-up. He is organized from the whole of the macrocosm and of all its component parts. That is why he is capable of receiving the influences residing in the whole universe. For the soul of the great cosmos has the same divisions, proportions, and parts as has the soul of man, and the material body of man draws its sustenance from material nature in a manner analogous to that of the foetus receiving its nourishment from its mother. Man's own soul is the quintessence of everything in creation, and is connected sympathetically with the whole of Nature; hence every change that takes place in the macro-



cosm may be sensed by the eternal essence surrounding his spirit, and it may come to the consciousness and comprehension of man.

Each planet has a different rate of vibration or motion: some are strong, others are weak or neutral. Each has a prototype in an organ in the

human body. Every planet co-ordinates with a specific part of the human body. These vibrations impinge on the human body—the epitome of the cosmos—but only to the degree that the blood stream is chemically pure and the body normal in function are we in a position to set up the corresponding cosmic rate of vibration, activating a given planet at a specific time of the year.

Because Spirit or Life is the All-Pervading and Unlimited Source from which all proceeds and to which all must return, many students of metaphysical, occult, and kindred philosophies assume erroneously that there is only one end to the pole of being, and that end has everything, is everything, and does everything. The spiritual element becomes active only to the extent that the human instrument through which it desires to act enables it to manifest that activity.

Power can be generated, namely, the invisible brought into the objective, only because of the attraction of the more ponderable substances. They are of the nature of Mothers or magnets. Just as the female attracts the male, so does matter (mater or mother) attract Father Spirit, the masculine principle which gives the initial impetus to all creative processes. The feminine principle, however, always does the active creative work on all planes; it is analogous to the Universal Mother Nature, from whose womb all things are born. Spirit and matter. father and mother, positive and negative are the two ends of the Pole of Being; comprising one and the same essence, they complement each other.

A seed thrown into the soil may grow and produce a plant, but this could not be achieved unless the seed were acted upon by the sun; the soil in like measure would be powerless to produce a seed, no matter how long the sun would shine on An adequate inbreathing of oxygen, the Life Breath (the male principle) depends upon a full quota of iron (the female principle) in the blood. Nothing from without, no breathing exercises can induce the entrance into the body of the finer etheric forces or air in absence of the chemical pull or attraction of the iron mineral element. Electricity cannot be generated until there is breath or air, the medium of Spirit. Only in direct ratio to the presence of iron in the body is the intake of that finer force called oxygen possible.

According to the Carey-Perry School of the Chemistry of Life, each mineral salt allocates with a specific part of the human body, and is absolutely essential to its integrity of structure and functional activity. Indeed the mineral salt corresponding to a particular sign of the zodiac and function of the body is consumed more rapidly at a specific time than are other salts essential to one's well being.

In her Zodiac and the Salts of Salvation, Inez Eudora Perry writes: "Nature and Nature's God now demand an ex-

pansion of consciousness in man. Disorganization, disruption and spasmodic reaction take place in the bodies of persons chemically starved in those 'mothers' or materials (mineral cell-salts) which Father Spirit demands at this time.

"Each human being is a battery, an aggregation of cells, and the law governing its charging is exactly the same as that with which electricians are familiar. It must have the necessary material to attract electricity, the proper kind and the right quantity. Spirit is never deficient. The trouble lies with the human battery. The only material that is so constituted that it has the power to produce light or fire is potassium phosphate," a basic mineral cell-salt. Potassium phosphate abounds in all protein foods (the first substance), occurring naturally in all grains, nuts, legumes, seeds, flesh foods, fish, and dairy products, providing also foundation building material for all fruits and vegetation, and the principal mineral basis of all protoplasm or cell structures. Many people, however, because of deficient digestion, abnormal function of the liver or other vital organs and glands are hindered in their capacity to release sufficient electricity from foods ingested; hence the consumption of the accessory mineral cell-salt, potassium phosphate, is well nigh imperative.

Obviously natural foods must not only contain elements for the renewal of tissues and for the production of bodily heat and energy. While the mineral salts furnish little or no potential energy, they are none the less indispensable in the performance of all the physiological functions of the system, in the processes of digestion and assimilation, secretion and excretion, in the neutralization of poisons constantly arising from processes of oxidation in the cells, and in the purification of the blood from waste matter.

If the chemical elements are not furnished in the right proportions, the living cells of the body are rapidly broken down in order to make up for this deficiency of our diet. Thus the mineral re-

serves of the organism are depleted, thereby lowering our powers of resistance. Sodium, calcium, and iron especially are Nature's real antitoxins, insuring as they do an ample supply of life-giving oxygen and the quick removal of such poisonous wastes as carbonic acid, uric acid, etc., from the system. Blood enriched with alkaline salts makes the digestive juices stronger and more effective; in this way more nutriment is abstracted from a certain quantity of food than when the blood is in an acid condition.

Despite the fact that the mineral salts comprise but five per cent of the human organism, they are nevertheless most vital constituents, each element having some distinct physiological duty. They hold the key to nearly all the material manifestations of life. They are indispensable in the formation of cells and tissues, giving them firmness and form. They are also the conveyors of vital electricity and magnetism, constantly recharging the human dynamo. The lifegiving oxygen is carried to all parts of the body through their medium. To enjoy perfect health and immunity from

disease, our blood stream must therefore contain all the necessary minerals in their wonderful combinations. For it is the blood that transports them to the different parts of the body, nourishing and cleansing the tissues and creating animal heat, magnetism and electricity.

The form or shape of each organ, part, or cell must be constructed in accordance with a geometrically perfect pattern. This is possible only by the presence of the exact number of particles and other chemical elements entering into their structure, for normal function is impossible when numerical and chemical imperfections exist. The indwelling Spirit is moreover inhibited in its efforts to manifest Christ Consciousness or perfection, nor can Spirit reside indefinitely in any vehicle, form, body, or coat of flesh if there is insufficient chemical attraction to retain it therein. Growth. action, and physiological processes must inevitably become chaotic or cease. To the extent that the cells of the cerebrum become chemically and geometrically perfect can they serve as a fitting receiving and broadcasting mechanism of the Father within.

Strange Facts About Meat-Eating

F all things that influence our health, physical, mental, and health, physical, mental, and spiritual, perhaps there is noth-

ing more important than our diet. To a great extent we are what we eat, as well as what we think. There seem to be at the present time an increasing number of scientists with spiritual insight whose experiments seem to prove that what we eat not only influences our bodies but our minds and souls as well. Such are the recent observations of Doctor Victor Heiser, author of the American Doctor's Odyssey. While in India, Doctor Heiser noted a strange mystery concerning the difference between the Sikhs and Parthians of North India and the Madrasis of South India-due mainly to diet. The Sihks grew six feet tall, husky and strong on a diet consisting mostly of sour curds, leafy vegetables, potatoes, and whole wheat bread, while the little stunted Madrasis lived largely upon fish, tamarind, rice, pepper, and spices.

That diet largely accounts for the different conditions of these two groups, the Sihks and Madrasis, is evident from further observations made by Doctor Heiser-especially the work of Sir Robert McCarrison of the Indian Medical Service. In his laboratory, Doctor Mc-Carrison had twelve cages of white rats that were the offspring of one parent stock. As Heiser approached the first cage of rats, a heavy, stocky rodent lunged viciously at him. His hair was rough and his whiskers bristled threateningly. He was ready for a fight. It seems that since the time this rat was weaned he had been fed on boiled beef, boiled mutton, boiled fish, boiled vegetables, tea, white bread and jam-the English working man's daily fare. It

was apparent that this cage of rats were ready to fight at the drop of a hat and would never be slaves to any.

The next cage that Heiser approached was filled with rats with pink eyes, round and placid. They had been brought up on the Sihk and Parthian diet, were as large as the rats fed on the British diet, but in contrast, their fur lay sleek and smooth, and they were gently disposed. Next came the cage of rats fed on the Madrasi diet, and when compared to those on Sihk diet, they were tiny, miserable little creatures-no bigger than large mice.

In another cage were rats that grew short and wide in the middle, with oily hair and whiskers twisted to fine points. They were rats fed on the French diet of pot-au-feu, rich in fats, also meats flooded with fine sauces, and salads drenched with oily dressings. The neighbors of these rats were short and wiry, and scurried about energetically. Fish, highly polished rice, and occasionally a crab had been the food of those fed on Japanese diet. In some of these experiments diseases were produced as well as cured by diet.

During the past decade it has been necessary for many families to reduce or entirely eliminate the amount of meat they formerly consumed; and strange to relate these families find their health greatly improved, and many of them are loath to return to the old habit of flesh-eating, although their financial condition has improved and made this possible. Meat, they know, is two-thirds water and is the most expensive article of diet. They also know that all the elements necessary to health are found in other articles of food in better form than in meat, and that the giving up of their meat diet has suddenly eliminated many of their health problems.

Ernest Crosby in his book The Meat Fetish reminds us that many investigators who are physicians are now, in the treating of rheumatism, absolutely forbidding the eating of meat. They prescribe a diet of cereals, vegetables, and fruits. Vegetable foods contain three to four times as much potassium as animal foods, while the much-needed sodium compounds are largely formed by oxidation of vegetable acids. Crosby mentions in passing the case of a large family of children in St. Louis that had never tasted meat until they were sixteen years of age, and when finally they were prevailed upon to taste it, it made every one of them sick.

Doctor Alexis Carrel, famous physician and surgeon of New York, author of Man the Unknown, and Nobel Prize winner, says, "We know that individuals fed on milk, eggs, vegetables and cereals differ from those fed on meat—that many substances may influence the shape of the body and consciousness. Endocrine glands and the nervous system probably become modified according to the forms of alimentation. Mental activities seem to vary with the constitution of the tissues."

Says Doctor Hereward Carrington in Natural Food of Man, "All the proteids that the body needs can be supplied by eggs, cheese, nuts, peas, beans, lentils, and kindred foods without resorting to meat to satisfy the bodily needs." And again in Death Deferred he calls our attention to the fact that the structure of a man's body shows that he is not fitted for a meat diet. Man has the long intestines of the graminivorous or grass-eating animals, and not the short intestines of the carnivorous creatures. Again, his jaws are hung so that he can grind one upon the other, like those of the cow, horse, and camel. Together with Carrington, such men as Cuvier, Linnaeus, Flourens, Bell, and a host of others contend that man is not a carnivorous animal, since he has neither teeth, stomach, nor intestines suitable for flesh foods. Says Cuvier, "The natural food of man, judging from his structure, appears to be fruit, roots, and the succulent parts of vegetables. It is, therefore, not natural for man to eat flesh. He cooks it and seasons it to disguise it." It seems to be the consensus of opinion that man came to adopt this unnatural meat diet during the Glacial Period when snow buried all vegetation.

Various physicians find that meat causes, as well as promotes, various diseases. The English physician, Doctor Josiah Oldfield writes, saying, "Flesh is an unnatural food and tends to create functional disturbances. As it is taken in modern civilization it is infected to an enormous extent with such dire diseases, readily communicable to man, as tuberculosis, fever, intestinal worms, cancer. It is of little wonder that flesheating is one of the most serious causes of the diseases that carry off ninety-nine out of every hundred people that are born."

If Oldfield lived in America he might also remark with the authors of 100,000,-000 Guinea Pigs that not only much disease but many deaths result from eating meat and fish that have even passed the inspection officers of our government. Speaking of the hamburger habit, they say, for example, "It is just about as safe as getting your meat out of the garbage can standing in the hot sun. For, beyound all doubt, the garbage can is where much of the chopped meat sold by the butcher belongs, as well as a large percentage of all the hamburger that goes into sandwiches. The red fresh color you see on chopped meat may be no more natural than the green color on St. Patrick's Day carnations—it may be there only by grace of a generous dosing of stale, partially decomposed meat with sodium sulphide."

Of course putrid meat is dangerous, but not as dangerous as the sulphide [preservative] itself which is one of the most severe of all digestive and kidney hazards. In the states that have adequate food inspection some of the decayed meat is seized before it has been sold. For example, in one state there were seventy-one out of seventy-six samples of hamburger picked up by inspectors that were illegally preserved. But so easy and profitable is the fraud, and so light the punishment, that it goes on with little abatement anywhere.

Hams, sausages, dried beef, are also objectionable because of the chemicals deposited by wood smoke. The whole business of meat inspection, so Doctor Edwin Oakes Jordan gives us to understand, "is carried on in such a way as to prevent too great business losses to the cattle raisers and meat packers, whatever the cost to the public health."

Contrary to the popular opinion, even the Federal Law allows meat from tubercular animals and animals affected with "cancerous lumpy-jaw" (actinomycosis) to be passed as wholesome food. It is stated thus under the Federal regulation that the "carcass may be passed even though every organ in the body shows evidence of disease, provided the inspector is willing to consider it slight and limited, and if the animal is fat." The report indicates that the inspectors are only too happy to find the disease "slight and limited." And thus from meat that has passed Government inspection we have, according to the National Civil Service Reform League, "some of the most terrible diseases which scourge the human race."

Doctor W. G. Savage in Food and Public Health again calls our attention to the astounding fact that about 18 per cent of the tuberculosis of the brain and its membranous wrappings, about 51 per cent of tuberculosis of the bowels, one-half to three-quarters of all cases of the glands of the neck, and probably about 20 to 30 per cent of tuberculosis of the bones and joints are of bovine origin. With more than 90,000 deaths from tuberculosis annually in America, this means that over 5,000 Americans yearly pay tribute with their lives to

business forces which decree that we must eat diseased meat and drink milk from diseased cows, so that they will not suffer unnecessary loss of profits. It is impossible to know how many more thousands die each year from other diseases contracted from meat-eating.

Moreover, the investigations of Arthur Kallet and F. J. Schlink, authors of 100,000,000 Guinea Pigs, further call our attention, in one of their investigations, to the fact that 22,500 cans of pink salmon, together with 425 kegs of salt mackerel were found which "consisted wholly or partly of a filthy, decomposed, or putrid animal substance." Only a few of the inspectors, we are told, catch what the Government describes as "filthy, putrid, and decomposed" products, although there is no scarcity of such.

Huxley and Wells in the Science of Life note that meat and foods exposed for sale are often badly infected with bacteria, partly from microbe-bearing dust and partly from flies. Furthermore, is mentioned the fact "that of 376 samples of shellfish which were examined, over 35 per cent showed evidence of sewage pollution."

It is of course common knowledge that over 10,000,000 people in the United States suffer from trichinosis, a disease caused from eating pork. This is a very serious disease which causes great pain and leads to general debility, fever, and an epileptiform type of brain disease, and often to death. In mild cases the symptoms are often mistaken for typhoid or rheumatism. The tiny wormlike parasite breeds in the flesh of hogs without apparently causing their hosts any great inconvenience. They pass often unnoticed through the slaughter house inspection, unless the carcass fairly swarms with worms. These parasites get into the pork eater's blood stream, and lodge in his muscle fibres where they surround themselves with little capsules or cysts. Special hazards lurk in hot-dog stands as well as in shops where hamburger which often contains pork is sold. How true are the words of the Kosmon Bible of the present era in which the Creator says, "In this era I make meat a poison to man."

Doctors both in the United States and abroad are beginning to see the danger of meat-eating; as for example, Doctor A. Kingsford of the University of Paris who says, "Meat may directly engender many painful and loathsome diseases. Scrofula itself probably owes its origin to flesh-eating habits."

Our own Doctor J. H. Kellogg comments, saying, "It is interesting to note that scientific men all over the world are awaking to the fact that the flesh of animals as food is not a pure nutriment, but is mixed with poisonous substances, such as uric acid. The vegetable stores up energy and it is from the vegetable world that all animals directly or indirectly derive the energy which is manifested by animal life through mental and muscular work." He notes further that at Battle Creek Sanitorium, appendicitis and cancer are practically unknown among those who do not eat meat.

Doctor Hereward Carrington notes that the highest stiumlant in food, meat, calls for the highest stimulant in drink, an alcoholic beverage. Says Carrington, "I have never known of a vegetarian who cared for drink in any of its forms; and I doubt if such a craving would be possible." Many social workers have verified this statement. For example, Major Cook, Head of the Salvation Army in Manchester, England, reports that in all his slum work, he has never found a vegetarian who was a drunkard. Moreover, vegetarians claim that the discontinuance of meat will cure the craving for liquor. Again, Bramwell Booth of the Salvation Army, after giving nineteen good reasons why men should abstain from meateating, says, "The growth of meat-eating among people is one of the causes of the increase of drunkenness." Then he continues to say that consumption of meat also favors indolence, sleeplessness, lack of energy, indigestion, constipation, eczema, piles, worms, dysentery, severe headaches, cancer, tuberculosis, other miseries and degradations.

Fowler, who has studied and lectured for forty years on alcohol also agrees with Booth and others, regarding the cause of drunkenness, and declares that the use of flesh foods, by the excitation produced on the nervous system, prepares the way for habits of intemperance-and that the more flesh consumed the greater the danger of confirmed alcoholism. The lower part of man's nature is undoubtedly intensified by the habit of charging himself with the coarser, and less developed vibrations of the animal. The feeding on "corpses" as many call it, not only tends to bring physical pain to man, but also mental and spiritul degradation.

The desirability of vegetarian diet will be apparent to any who believe in the inspiration of the various bibles given to man down through the ages. For example, the Hebrew Scriptures represent God speaking to Adam while in the Garden of Eden, and saying, "Behold, I have given you every herb bearing seed which is upon the face of the earth, and every tree in which is the fruit of a tree yielding seed—to you it shall be for meat." According to this account it was after the fall of man when death came into the world that a more degraded diet came along with it. If in the present new era we hope to rise again to Edenic conditions, overcome war and become a peaceful world, we must surely commence by abolishing the unnecessary slaughter performed in order to supply us with horrible and disease-producing food. Count Tolstoi, often declared to be the only real Christian in the world. wrote, "The future is with the vegetarians. The vegetarian movement ought to fill with gladness the souls of all those who have at heart the realization of God's kingdom on earth." But returning to the Hebrew Bible, we should note the meaningful words of Isaiah, the prophet who looked forward to the time when there would be no more devouring and slaughtering, when he said: "The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid. and the calf, and the fatling, and the

young lion together, and a little child shall lead them . . . the lion shall eat straw as the ox. They shall not hurt nor destroy in all my holy mountain." When the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord, the lion, it seems, as well as all other carnivorous creatures, will change his diet from flesh to hay or straw like the ox.

The Aquarian Gospel of Jesus the Christ tells the same story when it says, "If one is full of love he cannot kill. If man would gain again his lost estate he must respect the brotherhood of life. Whoever is not kind to every form of life—to man, to beast, to bird, and creeping things—cannot expect the blessings of the Holy One."

And among the numerous other revelations of God, one should mention also the Kosmon Bible, Oahspe, given to the world in 1881, which says regarding diet, "The Creator now commands a change from a carnivorous man of contention to an herbivorous man of peace. Man ate fish and flesh and became carnivorous, warlike, and darkness came upon him, so that he could not hear the voice of the Almighty or believe in Him, Behold it hath been proven in the warrior and pugilist how to raise a savage man by flesh diet and inharmonious surroundings; and in the nations and tribes of peace, how to raise a virtuous and industrious man, on herbs and fruit diet."

Many people who think it impossible to give up flesh-eating declare that they would lose strength if they became vegetarians. Science shows that just the opposite is true. Professor Fisher, from his experiments at Yale University, concludes that flesh eaters show less endurance than vegetarians. The Fruitarians of California have shown by statistics covering a number of years that abstinence from meat is consistent with health and strength. Again, Russell who made careful statistical studies of the diets of all nations, shows that strength and well-being are more common, and greater among vegetarians than among mixed feeders. The Hindus,

Chinese, and Japanese whose staple diet is rice can perform feats of strength and endurance unrivaled by any European, and European peasants who rarely eat meat are stronger than those of the higher classes who indulge in flesh foods.

In the walking races in Europe, again, the vegetarians come out far ahead of the meat eaters. Also Eustace Mills, tennis champion in England, America, and Canada never touches meat; Max Unger, and Annette Kellerman are also vegetarians, among numerous other celebrities.

Among the animals, the hard labor is done by herb eaters—elephants, camels, horses, oxen, mules, who all exceed in endurance any of the carnivorous beasts.

Horace Greeley once said, "I judge that a strict vegetarian diet will cause a person to live at least ten years longer than if he were a habitual flesh-eater, while suffering less than one-half as much sickness." It would seem that length of life is with the vegetarians.

The killing of animals causes brutality in the men who make it their livelihood. A man cannot devote his time to killing, and at the same time keep tenderness and love in his heart. Mary S. Brown in Reasons for Vegetarian Diet says that every murder committed in Chicago with the knife has been done by some one connected with the stockyards. Are not all meat-eaters responsible for deadening the finer sensibilities of some fellow man? In his higher development, man is neither a butcher nor a hunter, but a gardener. Those who can ignore the atrocities of the packing house can readily condone the savagery of civilized and Christian warfare.

Max Heindel says, in Teachings of an Initiate, "Until the connection between the food of man and his nature is understood and the knowledge applied to tame the passions and eradicate ferocity, there can be no lasting peace." This connection between meat-eating and war must be faced before the human race can advance very far toward that civilization





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
