There was a time, even at late as Greece, when *Religion*, *Art*, and *Science* were taught unitedly in the Mystery Temples. But it was necessary for the better development of each that they should separate for a time.

Religion held sole sway in the so-called "dark ages."

During that time it bound both Science and Art hand and foot. Then came the period of the Renaissance, and Art came to the fore in all its branches. Religion was strong as yet, however, and Art was only too often prostituted in the service of Religion. Last came the wave of modern Science, and with iron hand it has subjugated Religion.

It was a detriment to the world when Religion shackled Science. Ignorance and Superstition caused untold woe, nevertheless man cherished a lofty spiritual ideal then; he hoped for a higher and better life. Coming events cast their shadows before, and when the Great Leaders of humanity saw the tendency towards ultra-materialism which is now rampant in the Western World they took certain steps to counteract and transmute it at the auspicious time. They did not wish to kill the budding Science as the latter had strangled Religion, for they saw the ultimate good which will result when an advanced Science has again become a co-worker with Religion.

A spiritual Religion, however, cannot blend with a materialistic Science any more than oil can mix with water. Therefore steps were taken to spiritualize Science and

make Religion scientific.

The Unseen Power That Rules

OST people think that the generals and commanders, the prime ministers and the presidents,

the troops and sailors, decide the issues of war. This article is designed to show through a very outstanding incident that it is the Invisible Government that makes the decision. Our object in this article is to indicate the powers involved which operate behind the scenes, but not to predict their decisions.

The incident referred to was reported in the January, 1944 issue of the Reader's Digest, under the title, "A Drink That Made History" by Major Peter W. Rainier. Major Rainier calls it "A

A DRINK that turned the tide of the trice of the trice at El Alamein, and altered the course of the war." He further says

that the world generally believes that the German advance through North Africa into Egypt was stopped by the British at El Alamein but then he flatly contradicts this and says it wasn't; that it was due to something entirely different.

Before going further into this matter we wish to say that the Invisible Government described by the Rosicrucians, which governs international conflicts and determines their outcome, is composed of Race Spirits. There is a Race Spirit for each nation of the world today with the exception of the United States. The Race Spirits are under the direction of Jehovah, the God of War,

and the Spiritual Director of the earlier phases of man's evolution. The outcome of the present war will mark a turning point in world history in preparation for the highly advanced Aquarian Age, which will begin about 700 years from the present time. Thus we see how the Invisible Government looks ahead, far in advance, so that the right conditions will obtain when a New Age starts. The nations which fail to comply with the laws of the Invisible Government are due to lose their battles, and the ones which make real evolu-

Now to continue with Major Rainier's extraordinary account of what happened at El Alamein in the early part of July 1942. The main object of the conflict at that particular part of Africa was the capture of Alexandria, 50 miles to the north. We will quote the Major:

"On July 3, 1942, Rommel smashed our center and what was left of three Panzer divisions plunged through. Before nightfall they had covered half of the 50 miles between El Alamein and Alexandria. . . . Rommel's men could see the towers of Alexandria, the goal for which they had striven through two years of bitter desert warfare. Rest, food, water—particularly water for their parched throats—seemed almost at arm's length."

Major Rainier states that the military strength of both sides in this sector was about the same, comprising some 5000 men each. He says: "Great was the issue left to the valor of so few. Had we failed to stop Rommel's Panzers that morning, Alexandria must have fallen, all Africa would have been lost, Russia might well have been outflanked in the Caucasus, and the Axis tentacles could finally have stretched across Asia to join Japan. All through that hot desert morning . . . men on both sides were so close to exhaustion they could hardly see to aim through the sweatpacked sand caking their blood-shot eyes. Each army was close to the breaking point. . . . As soon as the grim will to fight had been drained to the last drop, one or the other would collapse. . . . Our men were fast reaching the end of their endurance, when the Nazis broke. minutes more and it might have been we.''

"And then an astounding, incredible thing happened. Eleven hundred men

FAR-REACHING EFFECTS OF THE BATTLE IN THE DESERT of the 90th Light Panzer Division came stumbling across the barren sand with their hands in the air. As they stumbled wearily

closer, the plot of that dread desert drama began to unfold. Cruelly cracked and black with coagulated blood, their swollen tongues were protruding from their mouths. Crazily they tore water bottles from the necks of our men and poured life-saving swallows between their parched lips. Later I talked with some of them, and this is the story they told:

"When they had broken through Alamein the day before, they had already been 24 hours without water. But at our overrun defenses they found a six-inch water pipe line. At various points along a two-mile stretch where it was above ground, they shot holes in it and men dropped to their knees to drink the cool, gushing stream. In all a thou-

sand men drank the water and took great gulps before their parched throats gave a belated warning—the water was salt! All night those men suffered unspeakably. Only the lure of quenching their thirst in Alexandria sustained them through the hours of that grim desert battle next morning. But when the Nazi infantrymen could bear the agony no longer, in a mass they started for our side—and fresh water.

"Why was that pipe line full of salt water? As the officer responsible for supplying the 8th Army with water through all its desert campaigns, I can give you the answer." He goes on to explain that the pipe line was a new one and that he always used salt water in testing new pipe. He said that if the Panzers had plunged through Ala-

mein the day before, that
SALT pipe line would have been
WATER empty; two days later it
VERSUS would have been full of fresh
FRESH water. As it happened, the
Nazis arrived just in time to

get salt water. Finally he says:

"The balance of that crucial desert battle was so even that I believe the Nazis—without that salted torture might have outlasted us, and then defenseless Alexandria would have fallen into their hands. On so small a turn of fate is history written!"

The foregoing is certainly a remarkable instance of the probable workings of the Invisible Government which decides the outcome of battles. It is hardly possible to assume that it was a chance incident when we know the principles underlying battles between nations, particularly when the outcome of the incident described by Major Rainier would have been so prodigious in its effect throughout the world.

It may be asked, What is the reason for such a world war as is now raging, why the Invisible Government permits it to go on and what result it expects to accomplish thereby. From our knowledge of the Rosicrucian Philosophy we can give the answer by saying that this colossal war is primarily due to the vast expansion of materialism among all the nations of the world, and the increasing denial by man of the existence of God together with the consequent augmented non-obedience to His commands.

In the Rosicrucian "Gleanings of a Mystic" it is stated: "The occultist who is gifted with spiritual sight knows... that each nation has a different Race Spirit which broods as a cloud over the whole country. In it the people live and move and have their being. It is their guardian who is constantly working for their development, building up their civilization and fostering ideals of

THE ROLE patible with their capacity for progress. . . . All civilizations when started by the different

Race Spirits have great and golden ideals but humanity by reason of having some free will and choice does not follow implicitly the dictates of the Race Spirit. Hence in the course of time a nation ceases to rise, and as there can be no standing still in the Cosmos, it begins to degenerate until finally the feet are of clay and it is necessary to strike a blow to shatter it that another civilization may be built upon its ruins.

"So when the handwriting is on the wall, someone is raised up to administer the blow; it may be a Cyrus, a Darius, an Alexander, a Caesar, a Napoleon, or a Kaiser. Such a one may think himself a prime mover, a free individual acting by his own choice and prerogative; but as a matter of fact he is only the instrument

of the Invisible Government of the world, the Power behind thrones, who sees the necessity of breaking up civilizations that have outlived their usefulness, so that humanity may get a new start and evolve under a new and higher ideal than that which ensouled it before."

In the light of the above occult information about the Invisible Government and how it directs the destiny of humanity, it is quite easy to suppose that the description given by Major Rainier concerning the drink—salted water—that made history was not merely an accident, but one of the innumerable methods used by the Invisible Government to bring about the result it desires.

The United States of America has no Race Spirit; therefore it might be asked why the U.S.A. has a part in this war. The answer is that the world is prepar-

THE PART OF THE U.S.A. IN PRESENT CONFLICT ing for the coming Aquarian Age when love and harmony will supersede war and hatred, and that the United States has a vital part in that preparation. But it is to be noted

that the American Army did not take part in the salted water incident as that battle was conducted between the British and the Germans, both of which nations have Race Spirits. Thus, the "fantastic drama of thirst that turned the tide of battle at El Alamein and altered the course of the war" was highly probably an expression of the Invisible Government and the methods it uses to accomplish its designs.

The Method of Attainment

HEN we discourse upon the method of spiritual attainment, it becomes necessary first to

emphasize that it is really not a matter of absolute free will whether we apply ourselves to attain or not, for to him that knoweth to do good and doeth it not, to him it is sin, and it is therefore fitting that we should further fix in our minds the responsibility of knowledge.

The lower kingdoms act under duress of the laws of nature, and the Group Spirit, which are both outside their creatures and encompass them on every side, leaving them no choice. The lion must prey, the plant must flower, and the mineral must crystallize. They cannot help themselves; but as they are thus dominated entirely from without by the Group Spirits and natural law, without choice, they have no responsibility for their actions. Neither do they know sorrow and pain in the higher sense, and they enjoy inward peace.

The creature which we call man, the personality rather, was like that in the Lemurian Epoch. The Spirits were outside the bodies, and the great Hierarchies ruled them without question along lines of cosmic harmony; hence

there was peace with neither sorrow, pain nor death.

Then came the so-called Fall, when the Spirit drew into its vehicles and dominated that vehicle from within, contrary to the laws of nature without. Then there were two opposing influences, and as a consequence they warred and the reign of sorrow, pain and death commenced

Now there is not only the war with others, but there is the war that is waged within ourselves. That is the The animals may fight one another, but there is peace within. humanity of today there is the fiercer war which is within, for we may rid ourselves of outside adversaries. But we cannot get away from ourselves, and therefore it is the acme of bitterness when a Paul exclaims: "O, wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death? for there was a constant war between his flesh and the spirit; or when Wagner and Faust are walking, what pinnacle of mental suffering is indicated in the words of Faust:

"Two souls, alas, are housed within my breast,

And struggle there for undivided reign;

One to the earth with passionate desire

And closely clinging organs still adheres,

Above the mists the other does aspire

With sacred ardor unto purer spheres.''

Paul in his anguish cries to be freed from this body of death, and it is that cry in each and every man which at a certain time starts him upon the Path of Attainment.

It is of the highest importance that we make no mistake but take the right road, and we can best see what that road is if we are very clear as to the path we have followed up to the present. Let us therefore clearly enunciate the steps of man from the lower kingdoms to Godhood.

In the lower kingdoms the evolving Spirits lack selfconsciousness and individuality; they are guided entirely from without by the Group Spirit and cosmic law, hence their existence is happy and carefree.

In the human kingdom the Spirit is within and the law is without. Cosmic law demands obedience, but the Spirit, feeling its divinity, refuses to submit to this dominating tyrant. Hence it breaks the law, suffers under the law of consequence, and chafes under its galling yoke, seeking for liberation and asking, as Paul, whence that is to come.

In the kingdoms of the Gods we have the administrators of what we call the laws of nature. Each divine being works in harmony with all the rest for the common good; each is therefore a law unto himself so that both the acting intelligence and the law are within. Thus they also are at perfect peace within.

We see therefore that the method of attainment is the transference of the cosmic law, which now dominates us from without, to the within so that it will act in conjunction with the indwelling Spirit instead of being opposed to it as at present. Therefore the Bible points to a time when under a new covenant the laws written on tablets of stone shall be abrogated, and the laws will then be written upon our minds and on the tablets of our hearts, as Paul expresses it in his letter to the Hebrews. This also was symbolized by the Ark of the Covenant, which had within it the golden pot of manna, representing man, the thinker, and the tablets of the law. with Aaron's rod as a symbol of the spiritual power attendant upon attainment, where man is not ruled by law from without, but from within.

The method of attainment is also pictured in the symbols of Masonic Temple legend, which is fully described in our book entitled, "Freemasonry and Catholicism."

Since that time the Sons of Cain have been continuously working upon the World Temple, and those who understand the more intimate side of the matter are also conscious of a work on the temple of man, which is a replica of the larger structure.

The arts of the sons of Cain are three-fold: Wisdom, Strength and Beauty. Statecraft, the product of the Sons of Cain, with its law and order is the means of curbing the turbulent impulses of the forces in the desire body and guiding them into organized constructive endeavor. It is therefore the embodiment of cosmic Wisdom.

Churches and benevolent institutions, the social structure of the family ethics, and such arts as music, poetry and literature work spiritualizingly upon the vital body as embodiments of *Beauty*.

All the technical arts, such as architecture, engineering, and inventions which make for comfort and increase physical well-being, promote the spiritualization of the physical body, and are embodiments of the Masonic conception of *Strength* and skill in action.

To live in the world we are forced to

comply with the demands of the laws of the country where we live. We must also render allegiance to social customs or we shall be ostracized, and we are forced to perform a certain part of the world's work in order to maintain ourselves. Thus we are slowly learning our lessons through association with others, and are working upon our threefold bodies to spiritualize them into soul. Therefore it is easy to see how disastrous it is to anyone to become a recluse and shun the society of his kind. By that act he actually stops his evolution and even retrogrades. We are placed here in this world to take advantage of the lessons here to be learned, and our environment is just what we need in the judgment of the Recording Angels who guided us here to a certain country with a certain religion etc., and it behooves us to live that religion first before seeking elsewhere. The path of evolution may be likened to a road studded with spears pointed in one direction. So long as we go the way they point, well and good; but if we attempt to return, we shall find the spear points sharp and dangerous.

The older race religions also know of a method of attainment that suits those who stand upon the corresponding plane, and their devotees may even aspire to the Christian Initiation under certain circumstances for that is progression. But for the Westerner to go to the East for initiation is a retrogression, and will bring serious results whether apparent or not. The reason is not far to seek.

In the beginning of human endeavor humanity was governed by King-priests of supreme authority from whom the governed had no appeal. They were the just rulers called Melchisedec in the Bible, and ruled humanity in peace.

Then comes the reign of divided authority where the temporal power is in the hands of Kings and the ecclesiastical power is under the priestly rule, still without the consent of the people who

are ruled, and who are made pawns in the wars, enmities, and strife between their spiritual and temporal rulers.

Next comes the republican government in temporal affairs, where any man may become the head if properly qualified. Similar conditions have also been tried in religious organizations, which call their spiritual advisers and dismiss them at pleasure.

In time even such rulership will cease, for each one will be ruled from within and unite in himself the offices of king and priest, for the Bible says that when the laws of God shall have been written in our minds and hearts it will be unnecessary for others to teach men to know Him, for they shall all know Him from the least to the greatest.

All who are under the Race Religions such as Buddhism, Judaism and Hinduism are yet bound by loyalty to their tribe or caste unless they emancipate themselves and embrace the Christian Religion, which preaches the cessation of allegiance to race and kin and the concomitants of priest and king. In the west we are feeling this liberty, and can only progress by extending this principle to the limit of our capacity.

The Rosicrucian method of Esoteric training has been well set forth in Lecture No. 11. It emphasizes that it is our duty to endeavor to progress when we have once become spiritually awakened. It requires but a few minutes a day if the pupil cannot give more. . . . It demands no obedience to the dictates of a Master, but only a pledge to self, which should not be signed till it can be done in childlike faith. Christ could do no miracles where there was lack of Then comes the patient endeavor at the esoteric exercises until one day individual instruction is granted. Then comes the meeting with the Teacher, who is the Friend in the highest sense, and to whom there is the strongest bond of affection, not tinged with fear for perfect love casteth out fear.

Those Mysterious Rosicrucians

HO are the Rosicrucians? This question has been asked by many who have wondered about

this secret band of mystics and occultists. The real beginning of this Order, which is to play a very important part in the shaping of the religion of the future, is shrouded in deepest mystery. Much has been written and many claims have been made as to its inception, but to endeavor to trace these claims and prove them brings the searcher up against a closed door. To trace them previous to the year 1313 A.D., when the Rosicrucian Order was founded, is impossible.

Let us go back into history before that year, and what do we find? A humanity dominated by a most dreadful octopus! For centuries previous to that darkened time the world was under the yoke of a priesthood which had become so cruel that human life was valued no more than that of an animal. The lavman was kept in greatest fear of the priestcraft, who were many in number. And the people were taxed so heavily to support the priests that the greater part of them were forced into direst poverty. This so disheartened the people that numbers of them drifted into crime and materialism. During the latter part of the twelfth century these conditions had reached a stage where our earth was in danger.

But our Heavenly Father is ever watchful of His children and will not permit them to come too close to the precipice. The Ambassadors of His Invisible Government are ever ready to lend a hand when the danger becomes too great.

During this dark period, when humanity had become seemingly hopeless

and life not worth living, there appeared an individual whose life and habits were shrouded in deepest mystery; a man whose physical body was not robust, but whose personality carried a magnetism which was felt by all with whom he came in contact. This person was known by the name of Christian Rosenkreuz—Christian Rose Cross. thing surrounding him was clothed in mystery. It was whispered about that he and the Brothers connected with him possessed great powers. This mysterious personage sent out into the world, four at a time, the Brothers whom he had trained. Wherever they remained for awhile they gathered about them a band of other similar Brothers, who lived a most simple life, healing the sick, and serving humanity in many ways. They shunned all mention of themselves, and worked unselfishly for the benefit of all without ostentation and in the most unobtrusive manner. Therefore but little was known of them before Max Heindel gave to the Western World the truth about these Brothers of the Rosy Cross. Thus no "history" of the Rosicrucian Order can be written. The Brothers preached the Gospel in the most secret manner, for the priests were ever alert and watchful for heretics.

Previous to 1313 A.D. highly developed Occultists, including Christian Rosenkreuz, worked under cover until the year 1614 when a small pamphlet printed in both the Latin and German languages was circulated by them among a very few wise men who were ready to receive the teachings it contained. The Brothers had not been idle and their philosophy prospered. Secret groups were forming.

Gradually a spiritual unrest began to

be felt which eventually burst into flames, and a religious and political uprising plunged Europe into civil warfare. This brought with it an intellectual movement accompanied by awakened spirits in search of the truth. These awakened ones refused longer to be bound by traditional forms and ceremonies. This reformation was an introduction into a religious realm theretofore forbidden to humanity, although the priests had long been familiar with its rites and secret teachings.

This upheaval brought about a new translation of the Bible into a language which the common people could understand, and Protestantism was the outcome. The religious freedom and the spirit of truth which had thus been awakened had direct connection with the early bands of Occultists and Mystics, the Rosierucian Brothers, who were secretly roaming over the country.

It is thought by many that the story of the Rosicrucians and the personality of Christian Rosenkreuz is only a myth, and that such a personage as Christian Rose Cross never lived; but the fact remains that the work of these Brothers actually marked the beginning of an epoch-making period of religious changes and the counteracting effect of material science, which is now wide-spread in the Western World.

The great Brothers of the Rose Cross have studied the secrets of nature for centuries and have kept their findings pure and sacred. There was a time when the sacred teachings were kept in secret by the Masters, and all who had gained any Light or reached Initiation must, for the sake of their lives, keep them secret. The Ecclesiastic Hierarchy forced all men to bow to its power, and this period was rightly called the "Dark Age" when many were forced to desert their religious connections. The result of this dropping away from their religion was a wave of crime and lawlessness which swept the country, for a religionless humanity is a reckless humanity, because the Star of Hope has gone down. When man is deprived of his confidence in his Maker, when he has lost his God, then he has reached a dangerous stage.

The Rosicrucian Teachings came to this "lost" humanity as a bright Star. To the thinking man it gave some hope. This Light which shone into the darkened world during those times has never gone out. The Rosicrucian Lamp was hidden and preserved until humanity had evolved to a greater mental understanding. Moreover this spirit, whom the world knew in the 13th and 14th centuries as Christian Rose Cross, is still inhabiting a physical body, and has appeared under the personalities of men who were guiding the work of the world. Death is not a necessity to one who has evolved to this high state; to such an Ego the discarding of one body to take up a new one is like taking off a garment to exchange it for one more modern and useful.

The Rosicrucian Order is formed on the cosmic lines of Seven, Five and One. The Brothers have always worked in Twelves; together with the silent and invisible influence of the Thirteenth, whose great power is felt but who is never seen. This group of Elder Brothers is still in existence; still working for the benefit of humanity. During the centuries that have rolled by since the Rosicrucian Order was first formed, they have worked quietly and secretly. They first aimed to mould the thought of western Europe through the works of Jacob Boehme, Paracelsus. Bacon, Shakespeare, Robert Fludd, and others. Then as now, each night at midnight when physical activities are at their lowest ebb and the spiritual impulse at its flood tide, they sent out from their Temple soul-stirring vibrations to counteract materialism and further the development of soul powers.

With the beginning of the twentieth century a further step had to be taken. It was realized that something must be done to make religion scientific as well as to make science religious, in order that they may ultimately blend, for at the present time heart and mind are divorced. The heart instinctively feels the truth of religious teachings concerning such wonderful mysteries as the Conception (the Mystic Immaculate (the Mystic the crucifixion Birth). Death), the cleansing blood, the atonement, and other doctrines of the church, which the intellect refuses to believe as they are incapable of physical demonstration and seemingly at war with natural law. Soul growth is accomplished only when both the heart and mind receive training.

Mankind had now reached a stage where it could be given a more exalted phase of the Christian religion, and where the Mysteries should be given to the many insead of the few. These are the Mysteries spoken of in Matthew 13:11 and Luke 8:10. The Rosicrucians, having studied the trend of thought for centuries, knew the path most likely to be taken by the majority of mankind; therefore they formulated their philosophy so as to give a teaching that would satisfy the heart and at the same time appeal to the intellect, and which teaches man to escape restraint by mastering self.

As the first and sixth decades of each century are the most propitious for the commencement of a spiritual teaching, the Brothers applied the necessary test to Max Heindel in the early part of 1908 to see whether he would be the chosen Messenger or not. Let not the reader suppose that this was some rite or ceremony to make one a member of a secret organization. This was a test conducted through a great temptation, for the Brothers use much discrimination before giving out such an exalted teaching. To be trusted with this mission indicated one of strong character and high soul development, for to supply the ignorant and weak with the powers of destruction would be equivalent to providing chil-

dren with gunpowder and matches to play with. Max Heindel turned out to have the necessary qualifications.

In due time he was invited to visit the Brothers in their home, which is interpenetrated by the etheric Temple, and was given instructions as to how to reach it. Accordingly, a little later, he made the journey there, where he became a guest as well as student, and where he staved a little over a month. During this time he was given the essential information later embodied in that wonder book, the Rosicrucian Cosmo-Conception. He was then instructed to return to the United States, have it published, and proceed to promulgate its teachings throughout the Western World. Thus much of the formerly secret lore of the Rosicrucians was given to the general public.

Where the Temple is located has ever remained a secret with Mr. Heindel. He could only reveal that it was situated in what was formerly Bohemia, near the border of Saxony, and not far from the noted baths at Carlsbad. But at no time did he divulge its exact location for the reason that were it to become known, the resulting publicity would destroy the peace necessary for the Great Work of the Brothers. There are many who have gone in quest of this Temple and failed to find it after long and diligent searching. Even the Lay Brothers and Sisters of the Rosicrucian Order do not ordinarily visit the Temple except on the nights corresponding to the Initiatory Degrees they have taken. However, any one of them, having taken one or more Initiations in the invisible body, can go to the physical home of the Brothers, which is interpenetrated by the Etheric Temple, in his or her physical body and have no trouble in finding it.

The Rosicrucian Temple is never guarded by a "door keeper" such as we find in ordinary lodges and occult order rooms. Neither do the Brothers exact a "password" at the door. But it is surrounded by an Aura, a spiritual wall,

which has been built by the Brothers who for years have worked and prayed here until the Temple rate of vibration has been raised so that only those who can respond to that particular rate can enter. Strangers, interlopers, and curiosity seekers when they come within a certain distance of the Temple are unconsciously turned in another direction. This very powerful vibration is the only "guard" needed to keep it free from undesirable visitors.

The Lay Brothers and Sisters through Initiation are admitted to the Mystic Midnight Mass, but only on the nights corresponding to the Initiatory Degrees they have taken. The vibration is different each night, therefore only those "who are duly and truly prepared, worthy and well qualified," can enter, and only on those nights to which they vibrate.

The early Rosicrucians were deep students of the Occult, and were accredited with great power. They were learned doctors, mathematicians, and alchemists, Supermen who understood the power necessary to turn base metals into pure They knew the secret that enabled them to make the famous Philosopher's Stone. These supposed powers were veiled spiritual secrets which infant humanity could not understand. But the learned man was instructed how to work with the tools of the spirit and was taught how to make this Stone. the formula of which is contained in the symbolism of the Rose Cross and which was wrought by Christ while inhabiting the body of Jesus: for in this noble School there is but one Teacher, the Christ.

The Rosicrucians teach that the virgin spirit is of divine origin, that it has clothed itself with a physical body in order that it may learn all the secrets of creation; that with this physical tool it must work its way from impotence to omnipotence; that the end and aim of human evolution is eventually to develop

the divine Superman; that the Red Roses of the Rosicrucian Emblem signify the purified, passionless blood of the evolved man; that man is unconsciously an Alchemist who is changing the baser man into the Superman, the baser metal being transmuted into the pure gold of the spirit.

All are engaged in the making of that priceless Jewel, the Philosopher's Stone. viz., the highly spiritualized human being, whether they are upon the path of faith or of knowledge; whether following the path of the Mystic or the Occultist, all are making the Diamond or the Ruby stone of the Alchem-But it is known that the highest alchemical work is not accomplished until the Will and Imagination, the mind and heart, the male and female principles, have been united by the blending of Fire and Water. "If the male Sun cohabits with the female Moon in the Water of Truth, they will produce a Son whose name is Wisdom." The attainment of this higher consciousness is the great arcanum that cannot be learned from books; it is the Magnum Opus, the Great Work, of which the Alchemists said that thousands of years may be required to perform it, or it may be consummated in a moment, even as by a woman while engaged in spinning. This is the "Mysterium Magnum" of the Rose Cross, the Mystic Marriage with Christ.

The present reawakened interest in mysticism and occult knowledge and the desire to delve into all things hidden, has started a corresponding wave of interest in Rosicrucianism, and many indeed have come and laved their souls in the illuminating teachings of the Elder Brothers \mathbf{of} the Rosicrucian Order. It is the purpose of the Brothers of the Rose Cross to give the teachings that will enable many to "form the Christ within." To those who have aligned themselves with this Mystery School we append the following important information from the esoteric writings of Max Heindel:

"Six hundred years ago the western outpost of the Mysteries was fixed in Germany, and the Rosicrucian Order commenced to teach the few who were ready. Today the outpost then established has nearly accomplished its work so far as it is possible in that place. It is now preparing a farther outpost on the shores of the Pacific Ocean, and some day, we know not when, but probably when the sun enters Aquarius, the Brotherhood itself will follow."

It is known to the occult student that in all systems of religion there is a teaching reserved for the Priestcraft and not given to the multitude. The Christ spoke to the multitude in parables but afterwards explained the inner meaning to the Apostles in secret. There has always been an exoteric and an esoteric teaching in each religion given to the humanity for which it was designed, and the esoteric instruction was given in Mystery Schools. But in the last few hundred years, with the advent of modern science, an intellectual part of humanity has appeared that does not believe in anything they cannot touch, taste or handle. In the case of these Egos the head has complete dominion over the heart, and materialism has squelched all spiritual impulses. It is therefore necessary that appeal should first be made to their intellect so that the heart may then be allowed to believe what the head has sanctioned. In response to this demand the Rosicrucian Mystery teachings aim to correlate scientific facts with spiritual verities.

In the past these Teachings have been kept secret from all but a few Initiates, but now Initiation is "open to whomsoever will." All who seek and knock will find the Temple of Learning, for though the secret Temple of the Rosicrucians is still hidden from the profane and ignorant, its teachings are no longer so mysteriously concealed as of old.

Our present materialistic age is ever ready to reject without examination the secret symbols and allegories of the past because it does not possess the treasures which they represent. Engaged in the pursuit of material pleasures it loses sight of Divine Wisdom and exchanges spiritual wealth for worthless baubles. Like Esau it is throwing away its birthright for a comparatively worthless mess of pottage. Losing sight of his destiny, man runs after the shadows and illusions of life, closing his eyes to the real Light of the World. Ruled by fear, man bows before the Moloch of superstition and ignorance and rushes into the arms of a cold and dead materialistic science to perish in its stony embrace. But the wise, whose far-seeing perception reaches beyond the narrow circle of his material environment and beyond the short span of time which includes one of his lives on this earth, knows that it is in his power to control his future destiny. He walks in the world, but he is not of it; and above his head shines that bright Constellation formed of Truth, Wisdom and Power, whose center is the Law, the germs of which can be found in the spiritual self-consciousness of every human being.



Cessation of Pain Through Self-Conquest

HROUGH all of human life and and its phenomena are woven the double threads of joy and

suffering. To human consciousness, focused upon the material plane of being in the bonds of selfishness forged by the lower nature of man, these feelings seem to be the only true realities. The human heart rebels at suffering as it exults in joy, but little effort is made by the personal self to comprehend truly their purpose as they are interwoven throughout his daily life.

Philosophic thought through the centuries down to the present has to some extent analyzed these seemingly opposed conditions, but without practical results so far as the mass of humanity is concerned, which is immersed in living its heedless life, careless and unthinking in the intense pursuit of mate-This is the natural conrial things. sequence of the development of the material or lower nature of man, as yet unequipped to comprehend the nature and purpose of human suffering and joy; unequipped because its dense covering of selfishness prevents the stimulative activity of the spiritual self save in brief flashes or periods.

According to Divine and Cosmic Law, man both individually and in the mass must eventually progress in soul growth far beyond the plane of sensation whereon his life is now focused. He as a self-responsible being or entity must come to recognize in ever increasing fullness that the life of sensation is but a school wherein he learns to discern something of the existence of his own inner, potential powers, with which he may rise to higher grades of evolution, and acquire ever enlarging knowledge and power. He must realize that the

qualities, attributes and conditions pertaining to the life of sensation and recognized through the avenues of sense perception are all agents or emissaries projected from his spiritual Ego into its lower reflection and working vehicle, the personality, for its spiritual education. After long and arduous training and discipline this may accomplish the subjection and purification of the lower personal self and bring about the promised conscious union with the Higher Self.

The selfish personal entity constituting the lower nature (animal, emotional, intellectual), and forever at war with the Higher Self, must eventually bring about its own release from bondage and and become blended with and absorbed by the Spirit of man.

Joy and suffering therefore are spiritual agents, and must perform in humankind their great share in the alchemical transmutation of base and impure human metal into the pure and shining gold of spiritual reality. When it is realized that God is IN man, that each man is the "arbiter of his own destiny," a potential Christ, the phrase, "the hand of God lies heavy on me," becomes luminous in meaning. To the keen and spiritually scientific thinker not wholly bound by materialistic concepts, it is clear that man's suffering as well as his joy is brought about by himself, and that no other being is responsible.

The Ego or God within is man's own teacher and guide, and his first achievement in spiritual development is to become aware of that Higher Self, and to place the personality under its direction. Throughout the ages this has occurred to many advanced souls. It ap-

pears a marvelous happening to him who experiences it, and many straight-way consider that the ultimate has been attained, that they have reached an advanced degree of consciousness, even "cosmic," instead of in reality having placed their feet upon a lower rung of the spiritual ladder.

Little real and lasting joy has been known among men through all the past centuries. Joy in its essence is purely spiritual, and to be really known must have a spiritual foundation, which as yet the race has not built. What man calls joy, its counterfeits, are the product of sense reactions and are but fleeting. And of course this applies equally to suffering. Therefore joy and suffering are agents of spiritual growth, inciting the personality to greater efforts for the attainment of the one and the elimination of the other. The results are more often than not disappointment and disillusion, which teach invaluable lessons.

Through the successive stages of evolution the vibratory action becomes more and more rapid, the Higher Self gradually absorbing, refining and controlling the personal self, until at last the day of true spiritual awakening arrives: light shines upon and illumines the darkness and man-human evolves into man-spiritual.

To all come occasional gleams of spiritual joy, which, if understood, truly foreshadow future possibilities of attainment. Dim and faint though these may be, they yet illumine the path man treads and ever urge him on to gain the spiritual heights; whereas merely human joy (pertaining to the personal self of sense) only urges on to material acquisition, placing false values before the true, and frequently means spiritual sloth and stagnation.

Pain is conceded to be the great teacher save by those who rebel at it and deny their own responsibility in bringing it about. Such as these must repeat the lesson over and over until it is learned thoroughly and becomes an integral part of the inner self, when the necessity for pain will cease. It then blends with its polar opposite, joy, and peace is born.

The lesson of the *oneness* of all life, of God and man, must be learned, for it is a basic concept of Truth. God, the Supreme Consciousness, is *all*, and within His being contains all the units of consciousness now functioning upon the separative planes of life. These individual units must seek and learn the truth of the oneness of all conscious being, each one a drop in the ocean of immortality.

At present these may be termed metaphysical and intangible concepts; none the less they must in the course of time become concrete truth to man, and as such made a living and vital part of his life and being. The age of spiritual realization approaches, for which the way is being swept clear of impediments and uncleanness, when such seeming mysteries will become clear and luminous in the shining brilliance of the Christ truth. The New Age Teaching holds the fundamental tenet that man is in essence a divine being; that he transmutes eventually the life of the senses into spirituality, constantly expanding in consciousness.

Man as an individual entity is responsible for his own spiritual growth, and therefore collectively that of the race; and although he is given all help and direction possible under Divine Law by the spiritual Directors and Elder Brothers of the race, yet the actual labor of transmutation of human into spiritual, man into God, the refining and raising of vibratory force as expressed in the individual being, is his task alone. Only so can he attain to true spiritual responsibility and become a wielder of Creative Force, a conscious and intelligent Creator in his own right.

A wealth of scientific detail is com-

prised in the above processes. At some time in his career man must take upon himself the duties of the life of conscious discipleship to the Christ principle of life. At this stage, or even previously according to the karmic status of the individual, there are seemingly showered upon such a one in some form great trials and suffering. have said this may occur prior to the conscious soul awakening, and in such cases it probably operates as the direct means of such awakening. Intense suffering, mental, moral, often physical, acute or prolonged, is often the direct means of opening and stirring into action certain inner centers pertaining to the intuitional self. thereby making possible certain spiritual contacts, the reception of spiritual stimuli, and allowing freer play of the spiritual currents. Those whose failure to comprehend the principles and processes involved in the above description, shrink from such action and are not yet ready to tread the Spiritual Path, to abide by its laws, and to share in its glorious results.

We have referred to the trials, tests and suffering seemingly showered upon the aspirant to the spiritual life at or about the period of spiritual awakening, and which may extend for a considerable time thereafter. This is identical with the "karmic outpouring" of nearly all systems of advanced thought, and is found in some form in all systems portraying spiritual discipleship. All dross and uncleanness of the selfish nature of man must be destroyed (transmuted). The conflict is long and ofttimes severe. It may seem finished and the victory won, when the monster of self again arises and threatens in another and more insidious form, whereupon it must be crushed again and again until finally it is disintegrated and transmuted, and the spiritual entity freed. Freed to pass through the doors of Initiation into Christ illumination and an ever expanding degree of consciousness, when it finally merges into the Divine.

We repeat, again and again the personal self asserts its dominance, and only through pain, the agent of the Higher Self, is the victory won and final self-conquest achieved. This condition once attained, pain no longer exists, for it has become merged in joy: the seeming opposites are blended and fused and recognized as one. It is a basic truth that with self-conquest comes cessation of pain, for the atoms of substance through which pain may manifest have been dissolved and transmuted into a higher vibration which is immune to pain. Then tears no more shall flow, for a spiritual stability of character has been established: emotion and sensation seated in the personality lose their power. The personality, the little self, has been transcended and gives way to the Christ Self, the heart and center of love and compassion.

The Christ within each soul waits, eager to claim Its own. When the heart and head of man (love and intelligence) shall blend, when the spirit's will shall absorb the human desire-will and both become absorbed in the Divine Will, then shall man regain his birthright as a conscious creator. Then shall suffering be no more; nor weeping nor wailing nor lamentation. Let us look forward to the coming races and ages in which these things shall be, then turn our lives to the labor of hastening their advent.

Therefore rebel not at the suffering that comes to you, for it is an angel in disguise. With yourself alone it rests to seize the opportunity it brings, to understand its meaning, learn the lesson and its application, and thereby grow spiritually. From your long past life periods you have brought atoms of untransmuted substance now incorporated in your bodily sheaths, express-

The Vital Body and Epigenesis

- Q. After the spirit, in its preparation for rebirth, has gathered the material necessary for the mind and desire body, what occurs?
- A. The seed-atom of the vital body is next aroused into activity.
- Q. Is its formation merely a matter of attraction like that of the mind and desire body?
- A. No, because those vehicles were comparatively unorganized, while the vital body and the dense body are more organized and very complicated.
 - Q. How is the vital body built?
- A. Afterward Jesus findeth him in the temple, and said unto him, Behold, thou art made whole; sin no more, lest a worse thing befall thee. (John 5:14)

And that servant, which knew his lord's will, and prepared not himself, neither did according to his will, shall be beaten with many stripes; but

Stars, Jewels, and Angels

UCH has been written on talismans of one kind or another, jewels figuring pre-eminently

among them. In order to convert a jewel into a talisman it must be correlated with zodiacal signs and their planetary rulers; set in specially selected metals of a nature to harmonize with the stellar influences; given astrological baptisms according to ancient formulae; after which it is believed to be the focus of magical powers—a talisman! However, quite aside from their use as talismans, some jewels were anciently valued in witchcraft and sorcery because it was thought that a genie or spirit dwelt in the jewel as in a house, and might be invoked.

In The Message of the Stars Max Heindel gives a brief discussion of the talismanic art. A study of the table on page 64 shows us at once that each planet represented, Sun and Moon excepted, rules over two signs of the zodiac, and that therefore there are two signs to which the same color and metal are assigned, although the stones attributed to them differ. We shall have a good understanding of this dual rulership if we think of each planet as expressing polarity according to place and circumstance, for each planet rules one positive

and one negative sign. Thus Mars rules the positive Aries and the negative Scorpio; Mercury rules the positive Gemini, the negative Virgo, and so on; in each case the positive being masculine and the negative feminine. All fire and air signs are positive, all earth and water signs are negative.

The planetary Spirit therefore expresses Itself masculinely in the masculine signs and femininely in the feminine signs.

Only in the case of the Sun and Moon do we find a single rulership: the Sun ruling the masculine, fiery Leo, and the Moon ruling the feminine, watery Cancer. Here we must think of the Moon and Sun, Cancer and Leo, as polarities. Together they constitute the keystones of the Arch.

To simplify our discussion we rearrange Max Heindel's diagram thus:

The Sun: rules Leo—gold, orange: ruby and diamond.

Mercury: rules Gemini and Virgo mercury, violet; precious stones: crystal, aquamarine, pink jasper, hyacinth.

Venus: rules Taurus, and Libra—copper, yellow; precious stones: moss agate, emerald, diamond, opal.

The Moon: rules Cancer—silver, green; emerald, black onyx.

Mars: rules Aries and Scorpio—iron; red; precious stones: amethyst, diamond, topaz, malachite. Jupiter: rules Sagittarius and Pisces—tin; blue; precious stones: carbuncle, turquoise, chrysolite, moonstone.
Saturn: rules Capricorn and Aquarius—lead; indigo; precious stones: white onyx, moonstone, sapphire opal.

To the neophyte of the Rose Cross, the chief interest in all this is not in the talisman as such but in the spiritual reality which it represents. It is not for nothing that the Desire World (also the Light Ether) has been called the starry or astral world. More fascinating by far than the talismanic art is the celestial craftsmanship of the glittering world which we may fittingly call the Cosmic Diamond, the source and prototype of every jewel.

The Desire World—or, specifically, the First Heaven—is in fact the home world of all Art. It is the world of beauty of form and color; vibrant with energy, scintillating, fiery. Music, of course, is also present there, but as an ephemeron of a higher world.

To really understand the spiritual nature of the talismanic principle, it is necessary to digress briefly into the field of alchemy. Although it is possible to do the work of spiritual alchemy without a knowledge of astrology, there is no question but that it does have, and always has had, an astrological equivalence; for example, it is stated in a medieval text that iron can be transmuted into gold only when the Sun passes through Scorpio. The signs of the planets, of the constellations, and of the seasons figure again and again in alchemical literature; and interwoven with all this is the Great Work, the making of the Philosopher's Stone, which is variously designated as a Ruby or Diamond.

Astrology, as well as alchemy, owes much to Arabic culture, for the alchemy of the Middle Ages came to Europe from the Arabs, the word "alchemy" being of Arabic derivation. One might almost say that Arabia is the holy land of Rosierucianism, or alchemy; for in

the legend of Christian Rose Cross we read that he tarried not at Jerusalem but traveled to Damascus and over into Arabia; and that he translated his master work, *The Book M* (on the secret forces of nature), from the Arabic.

Both Roger Bacon and Paracelsus (among others) named by Max Heindel as Rosicrucian Initiates, refer to Arabic sources of their knowledge; and Damascus, where C.R.C. tarried, was the home of the world-famed school of alchemy founded by Geber, whose name is important in medieval alchemy. search has shown (what the esotericist immediately suspects) that the works attributed to Geber are not by any means the fruit of one man's labor, but rather of a school operating in his name. At Damascus also dwelt the great Arabian mystic Ibn Arabi, whose mystical journev through the seven heavens of Ptolemaic astrology, under the guidance of a feminine "angel," is curiously similar to Dante's "travels" in the Paradiso: even including the ultimate vision of the Celestial Rose. also is considered by many to be a Rosicrucian Initiate.)

Now it is a significant fact that the alchemists were profoundly interested in the manufacture of glass and artificial gems; which throws considerable light on the genesis of the Philosopher's Stone, such as the alchemist sought to create from certain subtle essences. The earliest made glass was green, but transparent, or at least translucent, and so is gold leaf. Therefore the biblical "sea of glass" is likened to "gold," since gold leaf, if rolled thin enough, transmits a green light.

Alchemical records show that the basic substance in the Great Work is green: which in the glass-making allegory must refer to primitive green glass; called the Green Lion by alchemists. From this, by the addition of suitable substances, all gems were to be created. The great effort was directed, of course,

toward producing the Diamond or Ruby. (This process is not to be confused with the production of artificial true gems from a white sapphire basis, which, however, easily lends itself to alchemical interpretation.)

Max Heindel also speaks of the Ruby and Diamond as signifying the beautiful soul jewels of the occultist and mystic (not the ordinary Desire Body). Again, he speaks of the Mystic Emerald, the glory of Lucifer's Crown, which fell into the abyss of materiality. Lucifer's Emerald is the Green Lion of alchemy.

Now note that the Arabian mystics not only called stars jewels, but they also called Angels jewels (also Birds of God). Why call the angels Jewels of God? Obviously because of the jewellike scintillance of the angelic aura, which is often all that is visible to the rudimentary clairvoyant vision. voyants frequently mention the fact that at a distance a group of angels have the appearance of a starry cluster. which, upon approaching closer (in mental space), is cognized as consisting of humanlike beings radiating streams of color and magnetism, or having a starry light burning on the forehead, or above the head as in the Fra Angelico paint-The effect in the latter instance is very like that of tall candles. Ovoid auras of light and color are also seen.

Again, the various "astral" and etheric centers are jewel-like when awakened in the aura of the trained clairvoyant; the Crown of Thorns being a crown of diamond light, emitting thorns of fire. An angel of a particular Hierarchy may appear under certain conditions as a gigantic fiery Ruby flashing through the mental air, its glory shining in the upper portion of the aura corresponding to chest and head.

The alchemist is warned not to allow his mixture (Soul Body) to set and become vitreous and brittle; the fire must be neither too hot nor too cold, or the work fails, and neither Diamond nor Ruby is achieved. As the fire burns under the crucible, the auric forces rise upward from their root center in a fountainlike structure, reminiscent of the vital forces ascending in a tree, the jewel-like vortices representing the fruit or flowers. Incidentally, the sacred evergreen, or Tree of Life, was lovingly called the Prince of Emeralds by the Chaldeans, and was holy to them as the Christmas Tree is to us. The lights on the Tree are alchemical fires.

All of which leads to the inevitable conclusion that the true value of the jewel talisman is not to promote material success, but to purify the imagination, rendering clear and transparent what was before opaque, so that the imagination itself becomes the House of Glass, the Pure Crystal, in which the Angelic World is reflected.

To achieve this result through meditation, we take the precious stone as a symbol of an angelic Hierarchy, and follow through to the Archetypal Idea in which Planet, Angel, and Jewel had their beginnings. These can be correlated by using the diagram 9 on page 221 of The Rosicrucian Cosmo-Conception; and the diagram in The Message of the Stars, page 64. Note that no Hierarchy is attributed to Aries; but Max Heindel states that in his opinion the Lucifer angels are destined to aid us in the work of regeneration as figured in Scorpio and Aries (page 46, Letters to Students). Spiritually, therefore, symbol is properly the amethyst or diamond; the amethyst as a type of spiritual (poetic) love between the sexes; the diamond, hardest of precious stones, as a type of the Spiritual Will, also of the fiery auric envelope with its prismatic spears and shafts of light.

Similarly, the other stones may be meditated upon with their zodiacal and angelical correlatives; and when the imagination is sufficiently clear, when it has become the House of Glass, we shall "know, even as we are known."

URING the thirty days preceding the beginning of spring the sun moves through Pisces, the

last and perhaps the least understood of all twelve signs. After having passed through the eleven signs since the beginning of its cycle at the previous Spring Equinox, the sun usually brings about that unsettled condition in Nature during which winter is forced to make way for the spring that is coming.

Like the uncertain weather preceding spring, Pisceans are subject to varying They are naturally of a kind, sympathetic and peaceful disposition, with a dislike for crudeness and discord of any sort. This, and a high degree of sensitivity which enables them to feel deeply, tends to make them yielding and non-aggressive in such a way as to incur the misunderstanding of others so that they are often considered negative and weak-willed. Though intense, the "storms" of the Piscean personality are usually short-lived, and often of a subjective, inner nature.

It has been said of Pisceans that their greatest strength as well as their greatest weakness is their sensitivity to all stimuli, their tendency to non-resistance. In this sign are to be found the highest and lowest types of humanity. strained appetite for drink and drugs is often an affliction which can lead to a wasted misspent life. Or, with the aid of Neptune, ruler of this sign, Pisceans can live up to the higher side of their nature and become deep mystics, or inspired leaders in the world of art and drama, and can surpass even in material achievement.

Neptune passing into Libra at the close of 1942, after his stay of thirteen years in Virgo (where at some point or other he opposed the Pisceans' sun),

should not only bring relief, but also opportunity for readjustment and the restoration of a certain degree of harmony in their environment and affairs, and within themselves. It should now be easier for them to merge with their ideal, as the rays of Neptune, which Max Heindel calls the "planet of divinity," can bring the children of Pisces much in the way of inspiration and spiritual blessings. Sacrifice of self. however, is usually in some way or other the key to all of Neptune's treasures.

Uranus entering Gemini in 1942 and remaining there until the middle of 1949 will at some point during those seven years form aspects likely to bring unexpected and far-reaching changes in the Piscean's life. Max Heindel stated that altruistic love and other Christlike qualities find expression through Uranus. It should waken in these natives a deeper realization of their true relationship with others and with God. Those willing to work with Uranus will not find him disruptive, subversive or erratic, even during his inharmonious aspects, though he can create much wreckage if compelled to blast away forcibly the obstacles set up by selfish-Cooperation, altruism, devotion to the needs and rights of others, and a progressive and aspiring outlook are the lessons of Uranus to Pisceans this year.

Saturn, also in Gemini, continues for some time to test the motives of the Pisces natives, and urge them to build the foundations of that for which they Jupiter now in the Piscean's solar sixth house should bring many blessings involving health and occupation.



Food in Relation to Diet

Electrifying food news came last week from St. Louis. There, in a vat the size of a small room (1,000 cu. ft.), molasses, ammonia, water, air and yeast were being mixed. Every twelve hours this mixture produced a ton of good rich meat—nearly as succulent as the sirloin steak it takes two years to raise on the hoof, much cheaper, and much richer in proteins and vitamins. Furthermore, this new synthetic meat is so easy to make that its inventors already look forward to performing a modern-miracle of the loaves and fishes after the war among the foodless peoples of the world.

The new food is actually a new kind of yeast, with added flavors that make it almost indistinguishable from natural foods. Its makers, Anheuser-Busch, have demonstrated its possibilities by serving meals including two delicious kinds of soup, meat loaf, muffins, cheese sticks, even pie—all made of varieties of yeast. Since yeast is the richest known source of B vitamins and contains about 50 per cent proteins (twice as much as meat), it surpasses meat as sheer food. And pound for pound of protein, yeast costs only a fifth as much as meat.

Three years ago, however, a British chemist named A. C. Thaysen began to explore yeast's possibilities as a straight food. He developed a new strain (from a variety called Torula utilis) with a pleasant, nutty flavor, so cheap to produce (10c a lb.) that the British Government has started building a plant in Jamaica to make 2 000 tons of Thaysen's "food yeast" a year. Chemist Thaysen at most expected to serve his yeast in concentrated doses to supplement a poor diet; despite its pleasant flavor, he did not conceive of Torula Utilis as a candidate to upset the world's food economy.

But that idea did occur to a young research geneticist named Carl Lindegren at St. Louis' Washington University. He thought of developing yeast in a variety of flavors resembling staple food tastes. The Lindegrens cultivated yeast with spores, opened the spore sacs and crossfertilized them, in this way bred thousands of new varieties of yeast. Finally, they got some to the king's taste.

A Powder for the Future. Anheuser-Busch is now geared to produce millions of pounds a year. The process: 125 lb. of yeast is planted in a vat containing 7,000 gal. of water, a ton and a half of molasses (on whose sugar the yeast feeds) and am-

monia (which provides nitrogen that the yeast converts into protein). The mixture is kept warm, stirred by 1,000 cu. ft. of air a minute (without air the yeast would ferment the sugar). After twelve hours the prodigiously growing yeast, having multiplied its original weight 16 times, is a ton of flavorsome food. In its uncooked form it is a dry, light, brownish powder with a meaty, nutty or celery flavor, depending on the variety.

As yet the new food (actually a vegetable-meat) has not been named; it will not be offered under the unappetizing title of "yeast." The Army and Lend-Lease are already buying millions of pounds. Postwar possibilities are obviously enormous and the product's wildest enthusiasts stop at nothing: observing that a 10-ft. vat can produce as much meat in a year as 1,000 acres of pasture, they fancy that the world's cattle may be heading for the last roundup.—*Time*, August 9, 1943.

The occult scientist knows that in the process of evolution the great Leaders of humanity take everything into consideration, the food of mankind included.

The spirit, the real man, has four vehicles in which he functions, a dense, vital, desire, and mental body. During the different stages of man's development, special attention has been given to the formation and growth of each one of these vehicles.

At the time in past history known as the Hyperborean Epoch, man's vital body was given this special attention, and his food was a most potent factor in that growing process. The Lemurian Epoch followed the Hyperborean Epoch, and the desire body was developed by means of milk which was added to the diet. The lower and more material the thought, the greater the havoc wrought, and the

more pressing the need for quick repair.

Meat is the most concentrated and most easily assimilable of nitrogenous foods. Hence it was added to man's diet in the Atlantean Epoch in order to secure the quick nerve cell repair However, the more spiritual needed. man grows, the more his thoughts will harmonize with the rhythms of his physical body, and the less nitrogenous food will be needed to repair broken-down tissues; consequently a vegetable diet will be quite sufficient to supply his physical needs.

The next food given to evolving man will again be derived from the etherladen vegetable kingdom, owing to the fact that a new vehicle in which man will function in the future is being built by each, composed of light and reflecting ethers. Therefore the great Leaders of mankind through the agency of human beings, more than likely quite unknown to them, are already preparing a new food composed of vegetable derivatives which will take the place of meat in the diet of man just as rapidly as he evolves to the place where he no longer is in need of that particular form of nutrition.

Children Inherent Imitators

One trouble you will always have with your child is that he will insist on doing as

you do, and not as you teach.

Children are not inherently bad, as many suppose, but learn their ideas of right and wrong from their elders, principally from their parents.

If your child is easily irritated it can only be because you have shown the same

irritability upon similar occasions.

The child, of course, does not deliberately copy his elders but, nevertheless does so unsuccessfully. Your slangy expressions become part of the vocabulary of your child. . .

Example is always stronger than pre-

Children wish always to do the right thing, but often do not understand what is desired of them because you, yourself, do not do as you teach them to do.—Nature's Path, August, 1943.

There is no creature in the world that is as imitative as a little child. fore its conduct in later life depends largely upon the example set by the parents while it is passing through the impressionable years of early childhood.

Everything in the child's environment leaves its impress on the child for good or evil, and parents should realize that their slightest action may do incalculable harm or good in the life of their children.

Trying to teach a child to mind or to moralize with it is of little or no value in its early years for the reason that its mind is undeveloped, and therefore it has little or no reason. Example is the only teacher it really needs, for it simply cannot help imitating, that being the only method of growth accessible to it, particularly during its first seven vears. Moral training and reasoning both come later in the child's life.

During the three septenary periods following birth, the vital, desire, and mental vehicles are still in an undeveloped stage, and therefore forcing a child of tender years to think, memorize. or to attempt to arouse the emotional nature is like exposing a tender, undeveloped plant to the freezing blast of a winter wind, or the fiery heat of a blazing furnace; and the result would be equally as disastrous. This does not mean that a child should be prevented from learning from its own volition, but that all the child's development of thoughts, ideas, et cetera, should come gradually and naturally without any forcing process. And much can be done for a child by surrounding it with the right kind of playthings; those on which it can exercise its own ingenerate faculties; and it should never be given anything that is finished, so to speak; but rather toys that can be made to do things-built into something, or changed in form, all of which gives the brain something easy to work on that is both pleasant and instructive.

Spiritual Healing

Question:

Will you please tell me something about spiritual healing, that is, what it is, and how accomplished?

Answer:

Spiritual healing is accomplished by raising the vibration of the various vehicles in which the individual functions to such an extent that all crystallization in them is broken up, thereby enabling them again to perform properly their normal functions. There are various methods by means of which this may be accomplished. Contact with a highly spiritual person may bring it about, inasmuch as such a one may act as a channel for the higher spiritual forces which are thus inducted into the organism of the patient.

The Rosicrucian method is put into effect by what is known as the Invisible Helpers, who while working on the higher planes manipulate the finer vehicles of the patient, and also direct the healing force into his body as required.

Capital Punishment and Its After-Death Effects

Question:

I would like to know the opinion of Rosicrucian students relative to capital punishment. Somehow it has never seemed justifiable to me. Murder appears to me to be murder regardless of whether it is sanctioned by law or not; and the Bible states that we should not kill. I would also like to know if when a man is executed, he comes under the Law of Infant Mortality and dies in early childhood the same as a victim of accident?

Answer:

Rosicrucian students do not believe that capital punishment is justifiable under any circumstances, and know that all too often it results in a great deal of harm. As long as an individual is functioning in a physical body it is, comparatively speaking, quite easy to restrain the actions of such a one by placing him in an institution where he can do no harm to his fellow men. But when such a one is executed. he is actually set free in the Desire World, where it is possible for him to influence others functioning in physical bodies to a much greater extent than he was able to do while living in the world: and such a one is not slow in finding out his after-death possibilities and taking advantage of them. embodied persons often work upon individuals in physical bodies who have some sort of grievance against some person or even a community in which they live, inciting them to start fires, rob banks, wreck buildings, perhaps gratify some personal grievance, commit murder or some other crime equally atrocious.

On the other hand, if such criminals were incarcerated for the safety of the community, it would be possible that after a time they would change their views, repent of their crimes, and when release through death finally came in a natural manner, would go out into the

Desire World no longer a menace to their fellow men.

In the light of the foregoing it is easy to see that capital punishment is in reality subversive of the purpose for which it is used for the reason that it does not act as a deterrent to other crimes but actually fosters them.

Replying to the last part of your question as to whether a man executed will have to die as a child in the next life, the answer is, yes, he will, for the following According to the Law of Inreason: fant Mortality anyone who dies under circumstances which prevent the review of the life panorama does not reap the fruits of the past life. When an individual is executed, the shock, anger, resentment, et cetera, which he feels and the horror of the whole proceeding deprive him of the peace and quietness of mind that are very essential in order that he may obtain a clear cut record of the life which has just ended. Accordingly this lack of opportunity will have to be supplied by the advantages which are given in the First Heaven to all individuals who pass out during childhood.

THE SIXTEEN PATHS TO DESTRUCTION Question:

What do occult students mean when they talk about the sixteen paths to destruction? Are there really sixteen particular ways in which one may be destroyed?

Answer:

The sixteen races are called the "sixteen paths to destruction" because there is always a danger that individuals may become so attached to their own particular race that they become enmeshed in their race characteristics and cannot rise above the race idea. They will, thereby, fail to advance; they may crystallize, so to speak, into that race, and consequently be confined to the race bodies when they start to degenerate.

Previous to the time when races appeared, evolution moved more slowly

and there was ample time to make ad-Therefore the likelihood of justments. becoming fossilized was not so great nor so frequent. But the sixteen races are born and die in such a relatively short time that now there is a grave danger that those who get too much attached to a race and its characteristics may fail to make the grade. They would thereby lose out in their own particular scheme of evolution, and have to be held over until some future evolution reached a stage where they could drop in and proceed with their development in a new human period.

Perceiving Occult Truth Question:

I have friends who tell me that they will not believe anything relating to occultism which is not proved to them. What I want to know is how should occult students work with such people in order to convince them of the truth relative to occultism?

Answer:

One should never attempt to convince any body relative to the truth of occultism. All the occult student can do is to discuss the subject with those who he feels might be interested in it. It is not only a waste of time, but might be a real detriment to present ideas along occult lines to people who are not ready to receive them.

When a person has developed to the extent that he is sensitive, even a very little, to the vibrations of the superphysical planes, he begins to sense the existence of things which cannot be accounted for by purely physical means. Dietary Prevention of Disease

ORLD War II, or the Survival War, is bringing, slowly but surely, to the American people

the importance of understanding the fundamentals of a sound nutritional program. With the concept of total war now being clearly comprehended, there is the realization that every person in this country, regardless of age or sex is a participant in one of the greatest struggles of recorded history.

Physical fitness becomes practically obligatory and with the scientific information that we have on hand, a sound nutritional program can do much to improve the health of the nation. We can learn our lesson by the experiences of Germany in the first World War. spite of the fact that strict rationing was at once introduced in that country, by the third year of the war there was not enough food for the German people. Rolls made from straw were not exactly a delightful delicacy even for a hungry man. Not only was the efficiency of the German worker materially reduced, but in addition to social unrest there were many cases of malnutrition.

An army marches on its stomach and a poorly fed soldier is not a very efficient

fighter. In the same manner it is evident that poorly fed workers cannot produce at peak efficiency. It has been pointed out that the poorly fed civilian is as a rule timid, anxious, nervously unstable and lacking in efficiency. One of the penalties of war is disease and with overcrowding in a given area, a lowered standard of living as available consumer goods decrease, a shortage of physicians and dentists, an increase in fatigue, alternate periods of despondency and cheerfulness, and other unfavorable conditions, the morale of a country can be materially reduced.

Without food we cannot live. This statement is a truism. The human body needs food for growth and muscular development, the development of energy and power, the enhancement of mental alertness, and the prevention of deficiency diseases.

There is a negative way of expressing the importance of proper foods in our diet and that is to say that when something essential may be missing from our diet, something essential may be missing from us as a living working organism. And as a result an unfortunate condition may arise. Specific illustrations will now be considered so that the importance of this point may be properly stressed.

The human body makes its supply of vitamin A from a substance in plant foods known as carotene. It is also capable of getting vitamin A from certain oils... as from butterfat. During World War I, Denmark found a ready market for its butter and hence exported large amounts of it. Other fats were substituted in the family diets in the homeland. As a result of the lack of vitamin A, blindness began to show up among the Danish children. As soon as the Danish government limited its exportation of butter, this condition began to disappear.

We know definitely just what takes place in the human eye during the socalled "seeing process." The retina contains two kinds of structures sensitive to light. We call these structures rods and cones. When light strikes either the rods or cones, substances are broken down chemically. At night a driver is at the wheel of his truck. The substance in the rods which reacts to dim light is called visual purple which contains vitamin A. As dim light strikes the visual purple it becomes bleached. Vitamin A is released during this process. It is evident that there must be a continuous supply of vitamin A or the visual purple will be slow in forming. And if it is slow in forming, the eyes will not be able to adjust themselves to dim lights and an accident may result. Eating the proper foods containing vitamin A can either prevent or cure this condition. . . . Parsley, apricots, dandelion leaves, carrots, and yellow butter are rich in vitamin A.

Let us now examine the facts in regard to another disease. During infancy the soft cartilaginous bones of the newborn baby are converted into hard bone and the skeleton also undergoes certain changes. If less than the normal amounts of calcium and phosphate are deposited in these growing bones there results a disease known as rickets. This condition

usually occurs between the sixth and the eighteenth month in the life of a child.

This disease has been found where the diets of infants have not had sufficient amounts of calcium, phosphorus, and vitamin D or its equivalent—sufficient exposure to the beneficial rays of the sun. The word rickets means trouble with the spine and this condition was given that name by Glisson in the year 1650 in England.

We now know without vitamin D or the exposure to the beneficial rays of the sun, rickets will take place in the bone structure of the infant. Hence you can state that a deficiency of vitamin D does result in rickets. An examination of the human bones in rickets shows a decrease in the calcium and phosphorus content and a consequent relative increase in the water content.

While rickets can be prevented by exposure to the sunlight, this method is complicated by the fact that the antirachitic effects of sunlight are decreased in the case of children who are dark-skinned: it may not be convenient nor suitable to expose the body at the proper time to the rays of the sun; and the opportunity for such exposure may The statement has been be limited. made that over half of the children in the temperate zone show some traces of rickets, and that they might not be obviously deformed but their teeth might be malformed or soft, their legs bowed, their knee and ankle joints enlarged. The ultraviolet rays emitted by suitable electrical apparatus can be used at home. But the easiest way is to take vitamin D as part of the diet. This can be accomplished by the use of vitamin D milk, and vitamin D concentrates. Some of the foods do contain vitamin D but not in sufficient quantity to supply the necessary amount. Such foods are milk, butter, and egg yolk.

The disease known as scurvy generally recalls to one's mind the disease from which sailors for centuries have

suffered. However, soldiers, adventurers, explorers, and even the ordinary citizens who carry on many of the mundane affairs of this world, in past years have also suffered from this disease.

There were those who by keen observation felt that it was due to a very simple obvious fact—something was missing from the diet. The solution at first glance seemed just as simple—add that certain something to the diet. If fresh vegetables and fruits could have been carried on the old sailing boats the problem might have been solved in a very ordinary manner. But in the old days that apparent solution was out of the question. During the 17th century there is a record of scurvy being prevented by the rationing of lemon juice to the crew of a ship. The renowned Captain Cooke prevented scurvy among his crew by feeding the men sauerkraut. According to Dr. Lind, a surgeon in the British Navy, Bachstrom in 1734 claimed that fresh fruits and vegetables are alone effective to prevent the body from suffering from scurvy.

However, at the dawn of the 19th century, the British Navy solved the problem of preventing scurvy by making the rationing of lemon juice for its sailors compulsory. The sailors soon became known as "limeys" as the juice of the Mediterranean lemon was generally used. Then for about half a century this disease was no longer a problem until, as a result of politics, the juice of the West Indian lime was used. Scurvy reared its ugly head again. The juice of citrus fruits as a preventative was discredited. And when the potato crop failed in Ireland, scurvy appeared among many of the inhabitants of that country. The symptoms of scurvy soreness and stiffness of the joints. swellings and bleeding of the gums with loosening of the teeth and hemorrhages under the skin-were not exactly pleasant to see nor to relate.

Various theories were advanced for the cause of this disease until finally it was discovered that the cause was a deficiency of vitamin C. Theobald Smith, then chief of the Pathological Division of the Bureau of Animal Industry, described in his annual report for 1894-95 a disease in guinea pigs which was identical with that suffered by sailors on long voyages-scurvy! And Smith found out how to cause the dis-Unfortunately he did not assoease. ciate the disease of improperly fed guinea pigs with that of improperly fed human beings. But Holst, a Norwegian, was able to find out what foods could prevent and cure scurvy in human beings by realizing that the guinea pig also could get scurvy.

All that one has to do to prevent scurvy today is to include vitamin C in the diet. The three citrus fruits—orange, grapefruit, or lemon, will supply vitamin C. Ascorbic acid bought in the drug store is just as effective. Some of the foods, and there are many of them, which contain vitamin C are the banana, melon, spinach, cabbage, strawberries, potato, tomato, watercress, and Brussels sprouts.

The disease known as beriberi was recognized by the Chinese as early as 2697 B.C. Insofar as the western world was concerned it apparently was unknown to medical men until 1645 A.D. It is caused by a lack of vitamin B¹ in the diet. This disease has had widespread occurrence in the Orient, including the Philippine Islands. Towards the end of the 19th century, while the Japanese were beginning to build up their navy, the spread of this disease, which annually affected from 25 per cent to 40 per cent of their naval force, threatened to interfere with these plans. Polished rice, refined by a process which removed the vitamin covering of the outer coat of the seed was the main item in the sailors' diet. Takai experimented with the diet of the Japanese sailors. . . . What he did was to send two Japanese warships over the same cruise, with but one difference. The men on one ship

were fed one type of diet and the men on the other ship were fed a diet consisting mainly of white rice. The results were that in regard to the men on the ship that were fed white rice, more than two-thirds of them suffered from beriberi, while on the other ship with the experimental diet there were only a few cases of this disease. Further investigation showed that in regard to these few cases, they had developed among those men who did not eat the new foods.

As a result, the occurrence of the disease became negligible. What was interesting about these results was the peculiar fact that here was a case of the curing and prevention of a disease without a satisfactory answer as to the specific cause. Other experiments were carried on by successive investigators. The complete answer came with the isolation and identification of vitamin B¹ as the preventative of beriberi. Credit must be given to Ejkman, Jansen, and Donath, Williams and Kline and a host of other patient investigators.

It would be correct to describe beriberi as a nervous disease and in the early stages such symptoms as fatigue, headache, stiffness, and loss of appetite appear. It may strike at persons of all ages from infants to adults in the advanced stages of life. The word beriberi comes from the Sinhalese word meaning weakness.

Different types of beriberi have been described. In polyneuritis we find a condition in which control of all the muscles is affected wherein there is a lack of coordination in the movements.

Vitamin B¹ may be taken in concentrated form or in the crystalline vitamin itself, known as thiamin chloride. Wheat germ contains vitamin B¹, as does yeast. There are a variety of foods in which this vitamin is found as in whole grain cereals, peas, nuts, oatmeal, and squash.

Pellagra is a disease which is found predominantly among poor people. It

has occurred in Egypt, the Soviet Union, the Balkan countries, Italy, Spain, and the United States. In our own country as many as 400,000 cases annually have been reported and in Egypt as high as 30 per cent of the population has been affected.

As a result of the excellent work of Goldberger and his associates, who worked over a period of years with pellagrous patients in some of the southern institutions, it was demonstrated that this disease could be prevented or cured by a change of diet. Keen observation on part of these investigators showed that a disease known as canine blacktongue, which occurred in dogs fed a diet that produced pellagra in human beings, was in effect a similar disease.

The symptoms of this disease are at first, loss of strength in the legs, loss of weight, moodiness, and a change in the appetite. Changes in the skin may also take place. The tongue is affected and ulcers develop. In acute cases, severe diarrhea occurs. Dizziness, headaches, and paralysis may take place. Briefly, you can say that the poor victim is subject to the 3 D's—diarrhea, dementia, and dermatitis. The first scientific description which we have of pellagra was written by Casal, a Spaniard, in 1735. It was his opinion that the disease was due to faulty nutrition.

Niacin, or as it is sometimes called, vitamin P-P, or as it was formerly called, nicotinic acid, prevents and cures pellagra. Some of the foods which contain the preventative element are wheat germ, collards, cabbage, and yeast. The most effective foods in the treatment of pellagra have been yeast, milk, wheat germ, green vegetables, and legumes. Vitamin B° has also been used in pellegra studies.

The illustrations which have been presented all make one point very clear—there are dietary deficiency diseases which can be most effectively prevented by an adequate diet.


